BULLETIN COLUMN 3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Following God's Voice:

When I was in first grade, like many public schools during the 80s, our school put together a time capsule to be opened in the year 2000. As part of this, one of my tasks was to complete a writing assignment about what I wanted to do when I grew up. Out of all of the things that I don't remember from the first grade, I have never forgotten what I put into that time capsule: I was going to become a professional ninja.

One of our modern mantras that we have all heard growing up and throughout life is that we can be whatever we want when we grow up. We are constantly asked that question: What do you want to do? Advertising is flooded with inspirational songs and encouragement to "Do what you want," "Have it your way," or "Make it your world." All of these things are wrong. All of the popular ways of discernment, the ways that many of us were taught to sort through what we are supposed to do in life, are wrong and do not actually help us to discern.

As Jesus begins his public ministry, he is teaching, proclaiming the Gospel and curing every disease and illness among the people. Crowds are surrounding and following him. And then, as he is walking along the sea, he sees two brothers in a fishing boat. Notice that he does not ask Simon or Andrew what they want to do with their lives. Neither do they approach him with their applications and resumes, asking or even begging Jesus to allow them to follow. The initiative does not come from them. Rather he calls out to them. It is the same with the sons of Zebedee, James and John, and all of the other disciples.

Discernment in life begins with the question: What is God saying at this time? What is He calling me to do? Sometimes, He uses are wants and desires to help us discern His voice, but the mystics and Desert Fathers actually warn us otherwise. They instruct us to ignore our wants and desires when discerning. Emotions cloud our ability to see God clearly and recognize His call. Rather, the virtues, like prudence, knowledge of God's commandments, and wisdom are better guides.

To put in in another way: if we are trying to discern what God is calling us to do, would it make more sense that the call comes from our own voice, or actually comes to us from Him? This Lent, we will have a 5 week series on the Discernment of Spirits, which is how to discern God's presence so that, like Peter and Andrew, we can better follow Him in or day-to-day life.
