

# St. Mary's Outreach Center News for December 2020

For the month of *December*, we assisted 135 families with food for a total of 329 people of which 74 were children and 32 were elderly (this includes the 26 families adopted for Christmas). These numbers are in addition to approximately 21 homeless adults served. 239 items of clothing were given out, 8 coats and 6 blankets. Five packages of diapers and wipes were given. Thanks to our Board Members and volunteers who put in 301 hours in support of our services.

We are continuing social distancing and will be serving clients for food <u>BY APPOINTMENT</u> <u>ONLY</u> at 816-252-8649. The clothing room has been opened on a limited number basis. We are now accepting clothing donations. We would appreciate Winter clothing as well as men's jackets and coats. Donations should be brought to the Outreach on Tuesday mornings between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 p.m.
