



\*This Wednesday, February 17, is Ash Wednesday. Mass will be celebrated at Noon and 6pm with the distribution of ashes.

\*Remember, Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. Fasting is not just a spiritual diet. By denying our bodies, our physical hunger reminds us of the hunger of our souls for God, our longing for a deeper relationship with our Lord.

\*Every person 14 years or older must abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent. Every person between the ages of 18 and 59 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but they are not to equal that of a full meal.
