

March 25-26: 24 Hours For the Lord March 25 @ 9:00 am - March 26 @ 10:00 am In response to the 24 Hours for the Lord initiative, the Office of Divine Worship is co-sponsoring 24 hours of adoration and confessions with the Cathedral of St. Joseph in St. Joseph, Mo. and Holy Cross Parish in Kansas City, Mo.

The 24 Hours for the Lord initiative was first launched in 2014 by the Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization.

In his 2018 Lenten message, Pope Francis invited the entire Church to "celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation in the context of Eucharistic adoration". "Lent summons us, and enables us, to come back to the Lord wholeheartedly and in every aspect of our life," the pontiff said.

"Above all, I urge the members of the Church to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm, sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer. If, at times, the flame of charity seems to die in our own hearts, know that this is never the case in the heart of God! He constantly gives us a chance to begin loving anew."

The pope also desired that at least one church in each diocese around the world to remain open for twenty-four consecutive hours, offering an opportunity for both Eucharistic adoration and sacramental confession.

Gospel Reflection by Dr. Scott Mahn

In today's epic Gospel scene, Jesus relives in His flesh the history of Israel. We've already seen that, like Israel, Jesus has passed through water and been called God's beloved Son (see <u>Luke 3:22</u>; <u>Exodus 4:22</u>). Now, as Israel was tested for forty years in the wilderness, Jesus is led into the desert to be tested for forty days and nights (see <u>Exodus 15:25</u>).

He faces the temptations put to Israel: Hungry, He's tempted to grumble against God for food (see Exodus 16:1–13). As Israel quarreled at Massah, He's tempted to doubt God's care (see Exodus 17:1–6). When the Devil asks for His homage, He's tempted to do what Israel did in creating the golden calf (see Exodus 32). Jesus fights the Devil with the Word of God, three times quoting from Moses' lecture about the lessons Israel was supposed to learn from its wilderness wanderings (see Deuteronomy 8:3; 6:16, 12–15).

Why do we read this story on the first Sunday of Lent? Because like the biblical sign of forty (see <u>Genesis 7:12</u>; <u>Exodus 24:18</u>; <u>34:28</u>; <u>1 Kings 19:8</u>; <u>Jonah 3:4</u>), the forty days of Lent are a time of trial and purification.

Lent is to teach us what we hear over and over in today's readings. "Call upon me, and I will answer," the Lord promises in today's Psalm. Paul promises the same thing in today's Epistle (quoting <u>Deuteronomy 30:14</u>; <u>Isaiah 28:16</u>; <u>Joel 2:32</u>). This was Israel's experience, as Moses reminds his people in today's First Reading: "We cried to the Lord . . . and He heard." But each of us is tempted, as Israel was, to forget the great deeds He works in our lives, to neglect our birthright as His beloved sons and daughters.

Like the litany of remembrance Moses prescribes for Israel, we should see in the Mass a memorial of our salvation, and "bow down in His presence," offering ourselves in thanksgiving for all He has given us.


