



St. Mary's Outreach Center News for February 2021

For the month of February, we assisted 68 families with food for a total of 192 people of which 26 were children and 14 were elderly. The food items included approximately 1,589 items of food from our pantry (purchased by pantry and from your donations). In addition, St. Mary's Outreach Center is a distribution site for USDA commodities from Harvesters Food Network under TEFAP and the food baskets included approximately 2,095 items of food in January. In addition, approximately 20 homeless were served at the pantry and various locations by one of our volunteers. Along with the food items, we provide 6 to 8 items of hygiene depending on what we have. The homeless bags include approximately 15 items of ready-to-eat food, socks and hygiene items.

112 items of clothing were given out, 3 coats and 6 blankets in addition to numerous pairs of gloves, hats and scarves. Five packages of diapers and wipes were given. Thanks to our Board Members and volunteers totaling 30 who put in 250 hours in support of our services.

We have been truly blessed this season with clothing items and no longer need any winter clothing items.

Donations should be brought to the Outreach on Tuesday mornings between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 p.m.

We are continuing social distancing and will be serving clients for food <u>BY APPOINTMENT ONLY</u> at 816-252-8649. The clothing room has been opened on a limited number basis.
