

GOSPEL REFLECTION BY DR. SCOTT HAHN

Jesus, in today's Gospel, says that He is the good shepherd the prophets had promised to Israel.

He is the shepherd-prince, the new David—who frees people from bondage to sin and gathers them into one flock, the Church, under a new covenant, made in His blood (see <u>Ezekiel 34:10–13</u>, 23–31).

His flock includes other sheep, He says, far more than the dispersed children of Israel (see <u>Isaiah 56:8</u>; <u>John 11:52</u>). And He gave His Church the mission of shepherding all peoples to the Father.

In today's First Reading, we see the beginnings of that mission in the testimony of Peter, whom the Lord appointed shepherd of His Church (see <u>John 21:15–17</u>).

Peter tells Israel's leaders that the Psalm we sing today is a prophecy of their rejection and crucifixion of Christ. He tells the "builders" of Israel's temple that God has made the stone they rejected the cornerstone of a new spiritual temple, the Church (see Mark 12:10–13; 1 Peter 2:4–7).

Through the ministry of the Church, the shepherd still speaks (see <u>Luke 10:16</u>), and forgives sins (see <u>John 20:23</u>), and makes His body and blood present, that all may know Him in the breaking of the bread (see <u>Luke 24:35</u>). It is a mission that will continue until all the world is one flock under the one shepherd.

In laying down His life and taking it up again, Jesus made it possible for us to know God as He did—as sons and daughters of the Father who loves us. As we hear in today's Epistle, He calls us His children, as He called Israel His son when He led them out of Egypt and made His covenant with them (see Exodus 4:22-23; Revelation 21:7).

Today, let us listen for His voice as He speaks to us in the Scriptures, and vow again to be more faithful followers. And let us give thanks for the blessings He bestows from His altar.

St. Mary's Outreach Center News for March 2021

For the month of *March*, we assisted **67** families with food for a total of 281 people of which 45 were children and 26 were elderly. The food items included approximately 1,462 items of food from our pantry (purchased by pantry and from your donations). In addition, St. Mary's Outreach Center is a distribution site for USDA commodities from Harvesters Food Network under TEFAP and the food baskets included approximately 1,080 items of food in January. In addition, approximately **5** homeless were served at the pantry and 4 emergency bags were given out. Along with the food items, we provide 6 to 8 items of hygiene depending on what we have. The homeless bags include approximately 15 items of readyto-eat food, socks and hygiene items and the emergency bags include approximately 5 food items. Two medical prescriptions were paid.

In addition, 232 items of clothing were given out and 3 blankets. One packages of diapers and wipes were given. Thanks to our Board Members and volunteers totaling 25 who put in 332 hours in support of our services.

We would also like to give a special "Thank You" to St. Mary's parishioners and others for their support with food and other items as part of their Lenten sacrifice.

Donations should be brought to the Outreach on Tuesday mornings between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 p.m.

We are continuing social distancing and will be serving clients for food <u>BY APPOINTMENT ONLY</u> at 816-252-8649. The clothing room has been opened on a limited number basis.
