

GOSPEL REFLECTION BY DR. SCOTT HAHN

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that He is the true vine that God intended Israel to be the source of divine life and wisdom for the nations (see <u>Sirach 24:17–24</u>). In Baptism, each of us was joined to Him by the Holy Spirit. As a branch grows from a tree, our souls are to draw life from Him, nourished by His word and the Eucharist. Paul in today's First Reading seeks to be grafted onto the visible expression of Christ the true vine—His Church. Once the chief persecutor of the Church, Paul encounters initial resistance and suspicion. But he is known by his fruits, by his powerful witness to the Lord working in his life (see <u>Matthew 7:16–20</u>).

We too are commanded today to bear good fruits as His disciples so that our lives give glory to God. Like Paul's life, our lives must bear witness to His goodness.

Jesus cautions us, however, that if we're bearing fruit, we can expect that God will "prune" us—as a gardener trims and cuts back a plant so that it will grow stronger and bear even more fruit. He is teaching us today how to look at our sufferings and trials with the eyes of faith. We need to see our struggles as pruning, by which we are being disciplined and trained so that we can grow in holiness and bear fruits of righteousness (see <u>Hebrews 12:4–11</u>).

We need to always remain rooted in Him, as today's Epistle tells us. We remain in Him by keeping His commandment of love, by pondering His words, letting them dwell richly in us (see <u>Colossians 3:16</u>), and by always seeking to do what pleases Him. In everything we must be guided by humility, remembering that apart from Him we can do nothing.

As we sing in today's Psalm, we must fulfill our vows, turning to the Lord in worship, proclaiming his praises, until all families come to know His justice in their lives.



St. Mary's Outreach Center News for March 2021

For the month of *March*, we assisted 67 families with food for a total of 281 people of which 45 were children and 26 were elderly. The food items included approximately 1,462 items of food from our pantry (purchased by pantry and from your donations). In addition, St. Mary's Outreach Center is a distribution site for USDA commodities from Harvesters Food Network under TEFAP and the food baskets included approximately 1,080 items of food in January. In addition, approximately **5** homeless were served at the pantry and 4 emergency bags were given out. Along with the food items, we provide 6 to 8 items of hygiene depending on what we have. The homeless bags include approximately 15 items of readyto-eat food, socks and hygiene items and the emergency bags include approximately 5 food items. Two medical prescriptions were paid.

In addition, 232 items of clothing were given out and 3 blankets. One packages of diapers and wipes were given. Thanks to our Board Members and volunteers totaling 25 who put in 332 hours in support of our services.

We would also like to give a special "Thank You" to St. Mary's parishioners and others for their support with food and other items as part of their Lenten sacrifice.

Donations should be brought to the Outreach on Tuesday mornings between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 p.m.

We are continuing social distancing and will be serving clients for food <u>BY APPOINTMENT ONLY</u> at 816-252-8649. The clothing room has been opened on a limited number basis.
