

Gospel Reflection by Dr. Scott hahn

Israel's mission—to be God's instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth (see <u>Isaiah 49:6</u>)—is fulfilled in the Church.

By the "Word of God" that Paul and Barnabas preach in today's First Reading, a new covenant people is being born, a people who glorify the God of Israel as the Father of them all.

The Church for all generations remains faithful to the grace of God given to the Apostles, continues their saving work.

Through the Church, the peoples of every land hear the Shepherd's voice, and follow Him (see <u>Luke 10:16</u>).

The Good Shepherd of today's Gospel is the enthroned Lamb of today's Second Reading. In laying down His life for His flock, the Lamb brought to pass a new Passover (see <u>1 Corinthians 5:7</u>), by His blood freeing "every nation, race, people and tongue" from bondage to sin and death.

The Church is the "great multitude" John sees in his vision today. God swore to Abraham his descendants would be too numerous to count. And in the Church, as John sees, this promise is fulfilled (compare Revelation 7:9; Genesis 15:5).

The Lamb rules from the throne of God, sheltering His flock, feeding their hunger with His own Body and Blood, leading them to "springs of life-giving waters" that well up to eternal life (see <u>John 4:14</u>).

The Lamb is the eternal Shepherd-King, the son of David foretold by the prophets. His Church is the Kingdom of all Israel that the prophets said would be restored in an everlasting covenant (see <u>Ezekiel 34:23-31</u>; <u>37:23-28</u>).

It is not a kingdom any tribe or nation can jealously claim as theirs alone. The Shepherd's Word to Israel is addressed now to all lands, calling all to worship and bless His name in the heavenly Temple.

This is the delight of the Gentiles—that we can sing the song that once only Israel could sing, today's joyful Psalm: "He made us, His we are—His people, the flock He tends."

Dear Parishioners of St. Mary's,

Mark Famuliner (our past summer seminarian) will be ordained to the Order of Deacon on Saturday, May 28th at 10:00am at the Cathedral of Saint Joseph, located at 519 N. 10th St., St. Joseph, MO 64501. Bishop James Van Johnston Jr. the bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Kansas City - St. Joseph by the laying on of hands and invocation of the Holy Spirit will ordain me to the order of deacon. Following the ordination there will be a light reception in the gym across the street from the cathedral.

A brief description of what a transitional deacon is:

The final step prior to priesthood is the seminarian's ordination to the Order of Deacon, which is celebrated at the end of his third year of theological studies. At this moment, the seminarian ceases to be a layman and becomes a cleric, assuming the promises of chaste celibacy for the sake of the kingdom, respect and obedience to his bishop and his bishop's successors, and the faithful recitation of the prayer of the Church - the Liturgy of the Hours. He is capable of being the presider/celebrant of baptisms, weddings, and funerals. God willing this seminarian/transitional deacon will be ordained to the sacred priesthood at the end of his fourth year of theological studies. In May of 2023 I will be ordained a priest of Jesus Christ. This is the last intermediate step before sacred priesthood.
