

St. Mary's Outreach Center News for April 2022

For the month of *April*, we assisted **109** families with food for a total of **255** people of which **56** were children and **14** were elderly. The food items included approximately **1,873** items of food from our pantry (purchased by pantry and from your donations). In addition, St. Mary's Outreach Center is a distribution site for USDA commodities from Harvesters Food Network under TEFAP and the food baskets included approximately **3,304** items of food in April. In addition, approximately **15** homeless were served at the pantry and **1** emergency bag was given out. Along with the food items, we provide **6** to **8** items of hygiene depending on what we have. Two medical prescriptions were paid.

618 items of clothing were given out and **2** blankets. Three packages of diapers and wipes were given. Thanks to our Board Members and volunteers totaling **30** who put in **296** hours in support of our services.

We are continuing social distancing and will be serving clients for food <u>BY APPOINTMENT ONLY</u> at 816-252-8649. The clothing room has been opened on a limited number basis. Donations should be brought to the Outreach on Tuesday mornings between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 p.m.

Gospel Reflection by Dr. Scott hahn

The giving of the Spirit to the new people of God crowns the mighty acts of the Father in salvation history.

The Jewish feast of Pentecost called all devout Jews to Jerusalem to celebrate their birth as God's chosen people in the covenant Law given to Moses at Sinai (see <u>Leviticus 23:15–21</u>; <u>Deuteronomy 16:9–11</u>).

In today's First Reading the mysteries prefigured in that feast are fulfilled in the pouring out of the Spirit on Mary and the Apostles (see Acts 1:14).

The Spirit seals the new law and new covenant brought by Jesus, written not on stone tablets but on the hearts of believers, as the prophets promised (see <u>2 Corinthians 3:2–8; Romans 8:2</u>).

The Spirit is revealed as the life-giving breath of the Father, the Wisdom by which He made all things, as we sing in today's Psalm. In the beginning, the Spirit came as a "mighty wind" sweeping over the face of the earth (see <u>Genesis 1:2</u>). And in the new creation of Pentecost, the Spirit again comes as "a strong, driving wind" to renew the face of the earth.

As God fashioned the first man out of dust and filled him with His Spirit (see <u>Genesis 2:7</u>), in today's Gospel we see the New Adam become a life-giving Spirit, breathing new life into the Apostles (see <u>1</u> <u>Corinthians 15:45</u>, <u>47</u>).

Like a river of living water, for all ages He will pour out His Spirit on His body, the Church, as we hear in today's Epistle (see also John 7:37–39).

We receive that Spirit in the sacraments, being made a "new creation" in Baptism (see <u>2 Corinthians</u> <u>5:17; Galatians 6:15</u>). Drinking of the one Spirit in the Eucharist (see <u>1 Corinthians 10:4</u>), we are the first fruits of a new humanity—fashioned from out of every nation under heaven, with no distinctions of wealth or language or race, a people born of the Spirit.

12 Promises of the Sacred Heart

- (4) I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- (5) I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- (6) Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- (7) Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- (8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- (9) I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
- (10) I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- (11) Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
- (12) I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."
