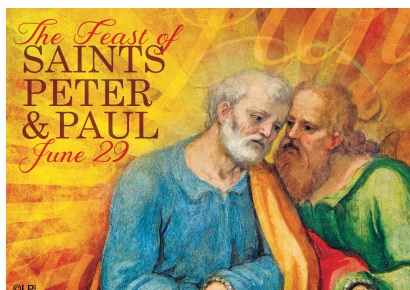

## **As Announced Last Weekend**

Fr. Kendall has been in conversation with the Bishop's office over these past few weeks, regarding the upcoming changes for St. Mary, St. Ann's and St. Cyril's. In order for him to faithfully fulfill the obligations for each of the parishes, there are required some changes to the existing Mass schedule.

Beginning on July 1st there will be the following changes to the weekly Mass schedule and confession times:

The schedule for weekend Masses, here at St. Mary, will continue without any changes: 5pm on Saturday, and on Sunday at 8am, 11am and the 5pm evening Mass will continue to be in the Extraordinary form. There will, however, no longer be confessions prior to the 11am Mass. Confessions will generally begin 1 hour before each of the other weekend Masses.

There will not be a weekday Mass on Mondays. The Masses on Tuesday and Wednesday will be in the Ordinary Form; and on Thursday and Friday in the Extraordinary Form. With confessions beginning 30 minutes beforehand.

There will be confessions beginning at 5:00pm on Thursdays.

Lastly, Fr. Timothy Leete has been assigned to assist with some of the Masses on the weekend. You will see him regularly, however, he will only be present to assist on the weekends and will not have any other formal role in the parish.

## Gospel Reflection by Dr. Scott Hahn

In this week's First Reading, Elijah's disciple is allowed to kiss his parents goodbye before setting out to follow the prophet's call.

But we are called to follow a "greater than Elijah", this week's Liturgy wants us to know.

In Baptism, we have put on the cloak of Christ, been called to the house of a new Father, and been given a new family in the kingdom of God. We have been called to leave behind our past lives and never look back—to follow wherever He leads.

Elijah was taken up in a whirlwind and his disciple was given a double portion of his spirit (see 2 Kings 2:9–15).

Jesus too, the Gospel reminds us, was "taken up" (see Acts 1:2, 11, 22), and He gave us His Spirit to live by, to guide us in our journey in His kingdom.

As this week's Epistle tells us, the call of Jesus shatters the yoke of every servitude, sets us free from the rituals of the old Law, and shows us the Law's fulfillment in the following of Jesus, in serving one another through love.

His call sets our hands to a new plow, a new task—to be His messengers, sent ahead to prepare all peoples to meet Him and enter into His Kingdom.

Elijah called down fire to consume those who wouldn't accept God (see 2 Kings 1:1–16). But we have a different Spirit with us.

To live by His Spirit is to face opposition and rejection, as the Apostles do in this week's Gospel. It is to feel like an exile, with no lasting city (see Hebrews 13:14), no place in this world to lay our head or call home.

But we hear the voice of the One we follow in this week's Psalm (see Acts 2:25–32; 13:35–37). He calls us to make His faith our own—to abide in confidence that He will not abandon us, that He will show us "the path to life," leading us to the fullness of joy in His presence forever.
