

Gospel Reflection by Dr. Scott Mahn

Jesus has a vision in this week's Gospel: Satan falling like lightning from the sky, the enemy vanquished by the missionary preaching of His Church.

Sent out by Jesus to begin gathering the nations into the harvest of divine judgment (see Isaiah 27:12–13; Joel 4:13), the seventy are a sign of the continuing mission of the Church.

Carrying out the work of the seventy, the Church proclaims the coming of God's kingdom. She offers His blessings of peace and mercy to every household on earth, "every town and place He intended to visit."

Our Lord's tone is solemn today, for in the preaching of the Church "the kingdom of God is at hand," the time of decision has come for every person. Those who do not receive His messengers will be doomed like Sodom.

But those who believe will find peace and mercy, protection and nourishment in the bosom of the Church, the Mother Zion we celebrate in this week's beautiful First Reading, the "Israel of God" Paul blesses in this week's Epistle.

The Church is a new family of faith (see Galatians 6:10) in which we receive a new name that will endure forever (see Isaiah 66:22), a name written in heaven.

In this week's Psalm, we sing of God's "tremendous deeds among men" throughout salvation history. But of all the works of God, none has been greater than what He has wrought by the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Changing the sea into dry land was but an anticipation and preparation for our passing over, for what Paul calls the "new creation." And as the Exodus generation was protected in a wilderness of serpents and scorpions (see Deuteronomy 8:15), He has given His Church power now over "the full force of the enemy." Nothing will harm us as we make our way through the wilderness of this world, awaiting the Master of the harvest, awaiting the day when all on earth will shout joyfully to the Lord and sing praise to the glory of His name.

Father Ketterlin's Corner

New Beginnings and Returning to our Sources
Throughout seminary (all 4 of them), Vatican II was an ever present theme and backdrop behind all of my preparations, formation and studies. One of the loudest calls from the council that continued to echo through my thoughts, especially during my time with the Carmelites, was the call of the council to "Return to your sources." In another way, go to your foundations; as one of my fellow novices often said on particularly challenging days: Remember why you are here.

Stepping into my first assignment in having the responsibility for a parish, and receiving a generous helping of three parishes, is certainly a challenge, one that is no less than what the Church faces throughout the world today.

To this challenge, she has directed us to go to our foundation, that is the rock on which we stand. Compelled by the Love of God and nourished by the love of our neighbor. We stand on the faith in Jesus Christ, the Son of God, on the shoulders of the Apostles, on the Church which they founded and on the Communion that we share with one another.

On a personal level, return to the sources reminds me that the parishes, St. Ann's, St. Cyril's and St. Mary's are not in my care, but rest in the hands of the Holy Spirit. I am not the Master, but a steward. My faith in the Master is my foundation and source. In Him, I know that He has plans for our communities: they are plans to prosper.

I am truly excited to get to know each of you and to see what unfolds over these next months and years, and discover what our Lord has planned for His church in north Independence and Sugar Creek.

Returning to our sources also carries a particular meaning for us over these next few weeks as we celebrate our parish feast days:

July 9th. St. Cyril's July 26th St. Ann's August 14th St. Mary's

Plans are still coming together, but we will have a celebration of some sort in each of the parishes. This will give us all an opportunity to give thanks to God for what He has given to our parish communities and to also get to one another better.
