

As you can see, we concluded last fiscal year with a deficit of **\$60,834.48**. While we exceeded the budgeted income by **\$26,154.66** thanks to your abundant generosity, the extraordinary expenses totaling \$64,768.10 far exceeded that which were budgeted.

The expenses were the result of two projects at the parish. The first was the ongoing renovations to Fitzgerald Hall. These renovations cost **\$16,892.48**. The second project was the renovation of the rectory. These expenses amounted to **\$43,942.00**.

BULLETIN COLUMN
THE ASSUMPTION OF THE
BLESSED VIRGIN MARY



At the Moment of Death:

We see, in the Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, the perfection of humanity and the example of one who received all of the graces that God desires to give to us. This is only fitting that He would bestow upon the one who gave birth, and raised His only-begotten Son, all of His gifts, without any reservation. We can look to her and see what He also desires to give to each of us, and would receive if we had not sinned. The graces that one receives at the moment of death, and the Grace of a good death is among those.

The moment of death is a privileged time in our lives. It is something that each of us passes through, yet it is also entirely unknown. There is a lot of room for doubt and uncertainty, not only in what is happening to us, but also in what is going to happen for those we love who will be left behind. As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we recall the graces God has in store for those who love Him, and the moment of her passing.

At the Assumption, what is called the Dormition by our brothers in the East, Mary was assumed fully, body and soul into heaven. She, unlike us, being the God Bearer and protected from sin ascended immediately upon her death. She died in complete peace, without fear, with full confidence in Her Lord, and free of any suffering. She passed from this life, into the next in the company of the Angels, and the Saints who had been raised with Christ.

These gifts await all those who die in a state of Grace. It is also one of the significant benefits and reasons for receiving the final sacraments: the Apostolic Pardon, Anointing of the Sick and Viaticum (communion). We also pray to St. Joseph, especially for those we love, as patron of the dying for a good and happy death:

Prayer for a Happy Death

O Glorious St. Joseph, behold I choose thee today for my special patron in life and at the hour of my death. Preserve and increase in me the spirit of prayer and fervor in the service of God. Remove far from me every kind of sin; obtain for me that my death may not come upon me unawares, but that I may have time to confess my sins sacramentally and to bewail them with a most perfect understanding and a most sincere and perfect contrition, in order that I may breathe forth my soul into the hands of Jesus and Mary.
