

For the month of *July*, we assisted **83** families with food for a total of **173** people of which **87** were children and **25** were elderly. These numbers are in addition to the approximately **37** homeless adults. **13** items of clothing were given out. Two packages of diapers and wipes were given. Thanks to our Board Members and volunteers who put in **377** hours in support of our services.

We are continuing social distancing and will be serving clients for food <u>BY APPOINTMENT ONLY</u> at 816-252-8649. <u>The clothing room will remain closed</u>. <u>WE WILL BE ACCEPTING FOOD DONATIONS ONLY</u>.
