



Parish Stewardship:

Sound System: It goes without saying that replacing the sound system for the church is one of or highest priorities. It's very likely that when we made the announcement last Sunday about raising funds for the sound system, that many people could not hear it. The estimate for the church is \$19,000 and for Fitz hall \$6,000. We need to raise at least half of the cost before committing to begin the work. Including proceeds from Santa Cal-Gon, we have around \$4,000 committed. If you would like to make a contribution, you can place it in the regular collection--indicating that it is for the sound system, or let Fr. Kendall know that you would like to make a contribution.

Fitz Hall Renovation: With Eric on staff, we have begun painting and putting in the new floor for Fitz Hall. We anticipate the cost of materials to be around \$12,000. This may seem like a lot, but if you go to Home Depot, they'll give you an estimate of \$7-\$15 per square foot for flooring, which would be \$21,000 on the low end.

Movie Nights: Friday Family and Faith movie nights will be coming soon. Each month we will show a movie that is inspiring, entertaining and formative in the faith. Such movies on Joan of Arc (inspired by Mark Twain's book); St. Patrick, various eras of the life of Christ and many others. We may even show timely videos like the recent interview with Bishop Barron and Shia LeBeuf. To do this, we need a Movie Night Coordinator--or two-- to take a lead in hosting the nights. Please contact Fr. Kendall or Tami if you are able to help.

What Happens when a church Closes?

Next Sunday, Bishop Johnston will celebrate the closing Mass at St. Joseph the Worker. It does not take much to imagine that this will be a difficult and emotional day for many. Over these next several weeks, we will walk this stage of the life of our parish together. A few immediate questions that people have been asking:

In the midst of these spiritual and personal questions, I wanted to take a moment to address some very practical questions that many people have been asking: What happens when a parish closes? What will happen to the church, the property and all of the money in the accounts? Who pays the bills? What will happen to all of the things inside the church and who takes care of them?

It may seem to some to be a small distinction between words, but it is important to say that while the church building at St. Joseph the Worker is closing, a parish cannot close. This is a place where our Catholic view of things, is different from much of the world. Canon Law (no. 515) defines a parish as: a specific community of the Christian faithful, stably constituted in a particular church (i.e., a diocese) whose pastoral care is entrusted to a parochus as its proper pastor, under the authority of the diocesan bishop. In other words, a parish is comprised of baptized Christians within a defined territory, who are given to the care of a pastor. Or, we could say that where there were two flocks, under the care of two shepherds (pastors), there will be one flock. The fence that was separating St. Joseph the Worker and St. Mary's is removed. Where there were two fields and two grazing grounds, now there will be one. This is why we describe a parish amalgamating into another.

St. Joseph the Worker becomes part of the parish of St. Mary's. The community that met there will be part of the community that meets at St. Mary's. Their history becomes part of our history. While they are drawn under the patronage of Mary, St. Joseph becomes a special patron of St. Mary's. The spiritual care and obligations owed to the people at St. Joseph the Worker, will fall equally to the pastor, or administrator, of St. Mary's. Similarly, the physical goods of St. Joseph the Worker parish, become part of the physical goods of St. Mary's.

In specific terms, all of the property, the accounts, all of the bills, and if there is any debt, becomes part of St. Mary's. Their care and good use falls to our stewardship as a parish, as a community of Christians, and primarily to me as the Parochial Administrator.. These are among the things that God has placed into our care for the good of His Church, and the care of His flock.
