

## Readings for 27th Sunday in **Ordinary Time**

Lectionary: 139 Reading 1 IS 5:1-7

Let me now sing of my friend, my friend's song concerning his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside; he spaded it, cleared it of stones, and

planted the choicest vines:



within it he built a watchtower, and hewed out a wine press. Then he looked for the crop of grapes, but what it yielded was wild grapes.
