BULLETIN COLUMN
 28TH SUNDAY IN OT

***Not a Spectator Sport:***

I think that we have all seen the signs, whether at a live sporting event, a political rally or seeing images as the camera pans the crowd: "Mahome field advantage" ; "Moooooooooose" ; "Bring on a Blue October." When my mom and I went to the Daytona 500, we carried our own sign: "Don't hit the Wal-Trip." Whenever and wherever crowds gather, we want our voices to be heard and express our love for those we admire, or have become fans of. This desire is not simply a product of our modern times. It comes from a human heart and it should be easy for us to imagine the crowds who had come to hear Jesus speak and see the miracles that the Son of God was performing, would have been shouting similar things. "Blessed is the womb that carried you and the breasts at which you nursed," came from a woman shouting her love and admiration for our Lord.

These are the words of a spectator. Someone watching from the stands, hoping and possibly praying that Jesus, or one of the disciples would have heard her cry and possibly nodded a "Thank you." But she received much more than she had likely hoped or bargained for. She received much more than a nod or acknowledgement. But the object of her love responded. Our Lord responds to us in ways that we are often confused by. It is true, the Mary was surely blessed to have the Son of God in her womb so close to her heart as to feed from her. Our Lord's response to her is not to say that Mary was not Blessed above all women. Rather, he asked more than simple admiration. Where the woman seemed to be content to stand in the presence of one so blessed, He wanted her to be blessed herself.

We could also say that it is like one who looked at the moon and shouted how beautiful it is for reflecting the light of the sun. How often have we stood outside at night and appreciated it's light? Or been disappointed when we could not see it because it disappeared behind the clouds? Our God, and our Lord desires more than for us to appreciate the beauty and light of the moon. He says, "Rather, blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it." In other words, I wish that you too become blessed and beautiful like the moon.

Remember where Mary's blessing came from. She heard the word of God proclaiming that she would bear the son of the Most High, believed it and accepted it. Whereas we think it is good enough to be spectators and admire others, our Lord says "I have something more for you ; I want you to become as equally blessed as my mother; I want you to join with me in the work of salvation ; Do not simply remain in the crowd admiring my Love, I want you to be a vehicle and channel of my Love."
