BULLETIN COLUMN  
 29TH SUNDAY IN OT

*Missionaries in Christ:*

At the moment of our baptism we are incorporated into the Body and Mission of Christ. Unlike other initiation rites and club memberships, this incorporation is not merely a signing up for benefits, or symbolic ritual that is meant to increase our emotional connection to a place or community -- I am particularly recalling my first weekend at Westminster College when we walked between long standing columns and were told that the next time we walked between them would be our graduation day. Whether baptized as an infant or adult, we are baptized into the work and mission of Jesus Christ on earth, and then Confirmed in the Holy Spirit, receiving the spiritual gifts that are necessary to continue His mission.

We are missionaries, sent into the fields of the Lord, and each with his own particular mission or job to do in bringing salvation to the world. Some are foreman and stewards with people placed under their charge; others are responsible for pruning or harvesting; some are asked to pull out weeds and others to make baskets for the harvest, while some are asked only to take baskets from one place to another. Everyone has been given a role in mission, and all are necessary for the fulfillment of salvation. And if each person has a mission, then also every community, or parish, is given and called forth in mission.

46 years ago, the Holy Spirit called the people in the rural area of Northeastern Independence to serve in a local church under the patronage of St. Joseph the Worker. The parish was called forth for a mission in prayer, in community and had a particular task in the work of salvation. Every parish is called forth and formed for a mission. We could even say, even though we do not often speak this way, that every parish has a vocation, a way of living that serves a particular need of the church and the community. Even though we don't speak often about this, we know that each parish has a certain personality and bears a particular fruit of the Holy Spirit. Some are extraordinarily charitable, others have strong catechesis programs or prison ministries, others become community centers, while others are powerful centers of prayer. Each parish is called forth and given her mission in service to our Lord. When a particular mission is complete, we are called to the next.

There is sadness at the coming of the end of a mission. Even in the joys of High School graduation, and release from the daily trials of the classroom, there are tears at the friendships and memories that we say good-bye to. When we leave a long-time job or move to another town or state we feel sorrow. And much of this is a Holy sadness. Contrary of popular parlance, I do not think of this sorrow as mourning, but rather, this Holy sadness comes from gratitude. We are grateful to our Father for everything that He has given to St. Joseph the Worker and the tremendous work that He has done for us through them. When He called forth the church, He had in mind a plan and specific tasks that He wanted for the church at St. Joseph the Worker. We can say: "Well done good and faithful servant". You have done what was asked of you and brought forth the work of salvation that the Master of our House desired. We are grateful and joyful to be serving with you.
