

Greetings...By Sister M. Regina

Since our *Labor Mariae* community is somewhat multi-cultural, two of the four of us were born outside the United States, we were speaking recently about greetings. In some countries, it is still common to use Christian expressions to greet others. In Germany, for example, especially in the South, they still say " $Gr\ddot{u}\beta$ Gott" which is the abbreviation of " $gr\ddot{u}\beta$ Dich Gott" which means "may God bless you!"

Sister Rosanna, who learned the Polish language at home, told us that the Polish greet one another with "Szczęść Boże," which means, "Joy of God". For farewell, the Polish say, "Z Panem Bogiem," which means, "With the Lord God."

In Italy, when you greet someone with "Sia lodato Gesù Cristo" (Praised be Jesus Christ), most people still know how to respond: "Semper sia lodato!" (Now and forever). The same expression is common still, too, in Germany, at least in convents: "Gelobt sei Jesus Christus." "In ewigkeit." Since we Sisters are devoted in a particular way to Our Lady, we would like to adopt the greeting common in other countries, but add Our Lady, saying when we greet someone, "Praised be Jesus and Mary." The response is "Now and forever." Is it not more beautiful to greet one another in the name of Jesus and Mary than to the rushed "How are you," spoken as you pass by someone?

In French, one says "Adieu" for farewell. The full phrase is "a Dieu vous commant" which means, "I commend you to God." Even in English, our phrase "Goodbye" derives from "God be with you." How much more beautiful to actually invoke God! I hope that you will not mind that we Sisters will be using the full phrase, "God be with you," instead of "Goodbye."

In most monasteries, the manner of expressing thanks is "May God reward you." Again, is it not good to bring God into our gratitude, instead of simply thanking a person? We Sisters will be responding "God reward you" to express our gratitude to you.

Traditionally, there have been greetings appropriate to the feastdays, as well. At Eastertide, the common greeting and response is: "Christ is risen, Alelluia." "He is truly risen, Allelulia." In Melkite Catholics greet one another at Eastertide with, "Christ is risen." "Indeed, He is Risen." At Christmastide, their greetings is: "Christ is born." "Glorify Him!" Would it not be wonderful to incorporate the Church's liturgical years into our greetings in that manner?
