

Indulgenced Acts for the Poor Souls Decree Extended for the Faithful Departed throughout November

A partial indulgence can
be obtained by devoutly visiting the cemetery
and praying for the departed souls. One can
gain a plenary indulgence visiting a cemetery
any day between November 1st and
November 8th. These indulgences are
applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory*

A plenary indulgence is also granted when the faithful piously visit a church or a public oratory on **November 2**, **the Feast of All Souls**. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required, that one Our Father and the Creed be recited**

*Due to the coronavirus pandemic and the need to avoid large groups from forming where prohibited, the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of 1 to 8 November. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on any day in November. and devoutly prays for the faithful departed.

**Regarding the Plenary Indulgence attached to All Souls' Day, November 2, this year, it can be obtained not only on the preceding or succeeding Sunday, or on the actual Feast Day, but on any other day of the the month chosen by each member of the faithful.
