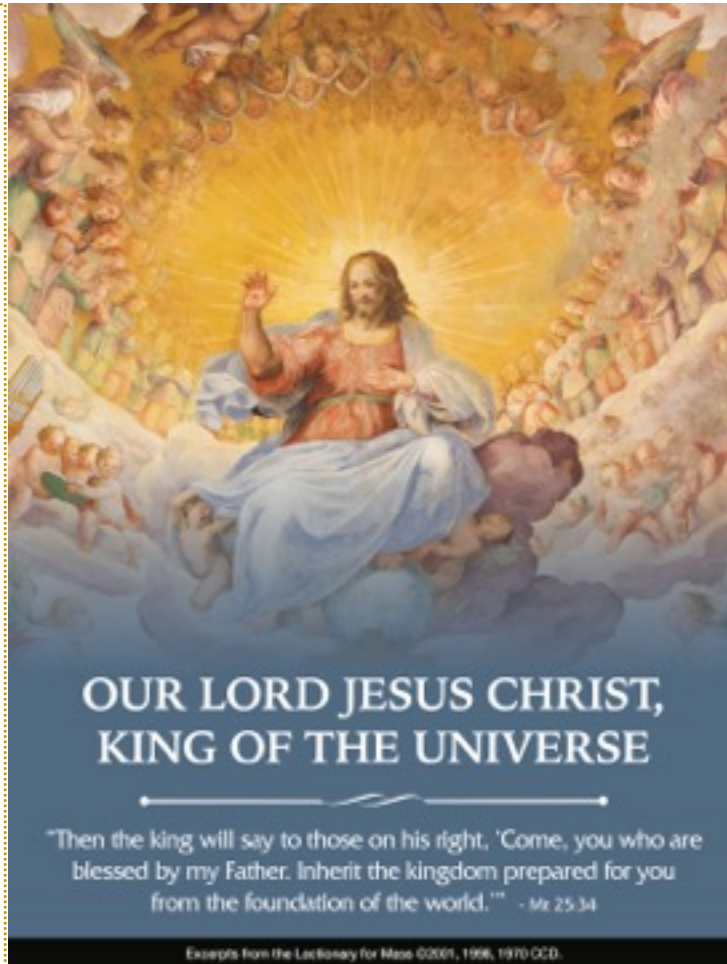

Indulgenced Acts for the Poor Souls

A partial indulgence can be obtained by devoutly visiting the cemetery and praying for the departed souls. One can gain a plenary indulgence **visiting a cemetery any day between November 1 and November 8**. These indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory.

A plenary indulgence is also granted when the faithful piously visit a church or a public oratory on **November 2, the Feast of All Souls**. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required, that one Our Father and the Creed be recited.

St. Mary's Outreach Center News for October 2019

For the month of October, we assisted 151 families with food for a total of 398 people of which 107 were children and 38 were elderly. 1,272 items of clothing were given to 143 families. We assisted 2 persons with prescription assistance. 6 packages of diapers and wipes were given. 18 Coats and 17 Blankets were provided. Thanks to our volunteers who put in 432 hours in support of our services.
