

BULLETIN COLUMN 1ST SUNDAY IN ADVENT



Bringing our Offerings:

What is the first thing that you do when you go to visit someone's home? Most people greet one another and say hello. If it's a dinner party or a kind of event when you have a gift, you would most likely hand it to the host. And you would generally ask one another how you are doing, even if it's an empty pleasantry or just a thoughtless greeting (like we so often do at the grocery store). If it is a true friend, or family member, we answer honestly and begin our visit by sharing how life has been since our last visit, and if there had been any major events. This is not the time to go into a long, detailed account, but a short, yet thoughtful encounter. In a real sense, when we come to someone's home, we present two offerings: any gift we may bring, and we offer ourselves. If we don't. If a visitor arrives and he responds tersely, or with an empty response, we sense the holding back and his distance. And truly, if we visit a friend without offering ourselves, maintaining that distance and simply be present, has it been a real visit? Is the real value of any visit that we offer ourselves, in an appropriate way, to the one we are visiting?

It is the same when we come to the church for Mass. We are offering ourselves to our God and Lord who called us, no longer servants, but Friends. Our offering begins as soon as we enter the doors. We have entered the Hosts home and offer words of greeting. This is what we call prayer. The time before the liturgy begins is time for a personal greeting; for us to share individually with the Master of the House how we have been since our last time visiting. To come 10 minutes before Mass begins is not early--it is arriving in time to greet your host on a personal level before the formal events begin. This is also time to offer in prayer thanksgiving for the blessings you have received, petitions for any trials and to bring to mind intentions for others.

It is also important to note that this time of prayer and preparation is personal and not an optimal time for communal prayers. Although beautiful and powerful in their own place, prayers like the Rosary and other Chaplets interrupt this time of offering and private preparation. This is why the Church has never included them as a formal part of the Mass liturgy.

Beginning with the 1st Sunday of Advent, I am asking that there be a Rosary offered only before the 8am Mass on Sundays. I am asking that there are no publicly prayers led prior to any of the other Masses, this includes weekday Masses. In this way, our local church offers this worthy prayer to our Blessed Mother each Sunday, while allowing the faithful the time of personal time with our Lord before the liturgy begins.
