


Saint Mary's Catholic Church

2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Jenifer Valenti, at 816.812.2500 or JeniferValenti@att.net, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. The Diocese has a sincere commitment to providing care and healing resources to victims of sexual abuse and their families.

Even though the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons have concluded, Holy Mother Church encourages us to continue to contemplate the Infancy and Hidden Life of Jesus and therefore we retain Christmas decorations at church through February 2nd. On February 2nd, we celebrate a feast known by various names: the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Presentation of the Lord, Candlemas. With this feast, we conclude our prolonged contemplation of the Christmas mysteries and begin to think of the upcoming season of Lent.

During the preparation for the Great Jubilee, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted that February 2nd be World Day for Consecrated Life. That first year, in 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II reflected in his message for the day, that “the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple is an eloquent icon of the total offering of one's life for all those who are called to show forth in the Church and in the world, by means of the evangelical counsels ‘the characteristic features of Jesus -- the chaste, poor and obedient One’.” Our Lady plays an important role in the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, since she is the one who carries Him there. Pope Saint John Paul II reflects upon her role: “The Virgin Mother who carries Jesus to the temple so that He can be offered to the Father expresses very well the figure of the Church who continues to offer her sons and daughters to the heavenly Father, associating them with the one oblation of Christ, cause and model of all consecration in the Church.”

We *Labor Mariae* Sisters have particular reason to celebrate on February 2nd of this year, because on that day we will have the joy of receiving two new postulants: Christina Ana Luna from Irving, Texas; and Andromeda Mary Regina Abushady from Vallejo, California. Please pray for Christina and Andromeda, as they begin their postulancy.

The Holy Mass at which they will be invested with the Miraculous Medal, which marks the beginning of their postulancy, will be on Saturday, February 2nd, at 9:00 A.M. You are welcome to attend this traditional Latin Mass. The morning Mass will *not* include the blessing of candles, since there is a second Mass at Saint Mary's on the same day, at which candles *will* be blessed. The Diocesan sponsored Holy Mass at 7:00 P.M., at Saint Mary's, will also be a traditional Latin Mass. The evening Mass will be offered in particular for the intention of parents and family members who have experienced the loss of a child through death, miscarriage or abortion, and for couples who are struggling to conceive a child.

prayerful waiting!**


This weekend we celebrate the dedication of our altar, two years ago. Obviously, the parish is much older than that, but the true date of our parish dedication has been lost to time. Therefore, we celebrate the dedication of our parish on the day when our new altar was consecrated. A church is a holy place, and its consecration is justly celebrated. How do you celebrate in your homes? If you have not had your house blessed at Epiphany, perhaps this weekend is a good one to do so, consecrating our homes and our lives to God, as we commemorate the consecration of our parish church.

The motet this weekend may be familiar to you, but is the gradual for this feast day (the long chant in the Latin Mass after the Epistle that the Responsorial Psalm replaced). The text is:

Locus Iste-Anton Bruckner

*Locus iste a Deo factus est, inestimabile
sacramentum, *irreprehensibilis est.
Deus, cui adstat Angelorum chorus, *
exaudi preces servorum tuorum.*

***This place was made by God,
a priceless mystery;
it is without reproof.
God with your angels' choir,
listen the prayer of your servants.***
