

The Christmas season is one of the times of the year when we see some significant differences between the calendars for the Extraordinary Form and Novus Ordo. In particular, please be attentive to the Holy Days of Obligation. The upcoming days of obligation are: Epiphany and Mary, Mother of God. It is important that you attend Mass on the day of the celebration in the New Calendar: It is the date, not the prayers of the Mass that is key. If you attend the low Mass on Jan. 1, this meets the obligation, even though the traditional calendar celebrates Mary, Mother of God on October 11th. Likewise, while the Traditional calendar retains Epiphany on Jan. 6th, attending Mass on Sunday Jan. 8th fulfills the obligation, one is not obliged to go on Jan. 6th.



#### BULLETIN COLUMN CHRISTMAS DAY



#### A Day of Rest and Adoration:

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A few weeks ago I was walking through the store when a few words of the song playing overhead caught my attention: Let's make this Christmas mean something this year. It is the kind of song that several years ago I would have loved and played over and over again. It is a beautiful idea of not only looking deeper in to the real meaning of Christmas, looking beyond Frosty's birthday and the Grinch's conversion, and being inspired to open the meaning of Christmas for others; to be more intentional about decorations and presents so that this year I could make it mean something special. I am also reminded of another song I found very inspiring several years ago. The refrain went like this: Heal the world. Make it a better place. For you and for me and the entire human race. And yet, both of these songs trouble me today.

The whole point of Christmas, the Nativity of the Lord, is that we are not the ones who make it mean anything; we are not the ones who heal the world; we do not make it a better place.

On the day that our Lord was born, the world changed. All of creation was changed in an instant, not only because the promises of salvation and the redemption of mankind had been born into flesh. But the fabric of reality itself was changed. God, an incorporeal, infinite, immortal and eternal being became human, fragile, mortal, weak and limited. The One who raised the foundations of heaven and earth, could not even raise his own head. He came to make all things new. How could we possibly make his birth, the act of the eternal Son emptying Himself, mean something? Can we make a sunset beautiful?

Our task is not to make Christmas mean something, but to see the meaning that is already there. We do not make Christmas special; it is already special. As we often pray: Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. Enkindle in them the fire of your love and You shall renew the face of the earth. God poured out His Holy Spirit upon the virgin so as to bring forth His only Begotten Son, so that He would give sight to the blind; restore hearing to the deaf; give strength to the lame and the weak; and set the captives free.

This is the day above all other days, when we do nothing, but receive. God comes to us. He so loved us, that He has come. To love Him, adore Him, give Him thanks, allow Him to change the world; take rest in Him and in His salvation. Ask Hm to show you the meaning of Christmas; to pull back the veil of the mystery just a little more this year. It is a day to simply look upon the face of Jesus and know that God is with us and He has chosen to heal the world.
