#### Lent: A Time of Strong Grace By Sister Paige

This past Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, we began the holy liturgical season of Lent. This period of approximately 40 days is a penitential season meant to prepare us for the holiest days of the year: namely those of Holy Week and Easter.

Why is Lent 40 days? 40 is a significant number in salvation history and signifies solemnity and penance. In Genesis 7:12, the flood that covered the earth destroying every creature save those Noah brought aboard the ark, lasted for 40 days and 40 nights. In Numbers 14:33 the people of Israel wander for 40 years in the dessert before coming to the promised land. Moses, who represents the Law, and Elias who represents the prophets, both had encounters with God on mountains; Moses on Sinai and Elias on Horeb. Before each of these holy meetings, they were required to fast for 40 days in explation. There are various other examples, but the most eloquent is that of Our Lord Himself who spent 40 days and 40 nights fasting in the desert before beginning His public ministry. As Christians, we are called to imitate Jesus as perfectly as possible. That is why we practice Lent for 40 days and nights.

The Church teaches that Lent is a time of spiritual battle. We are fighting three enemies: the world, the flesh, and the devil. Jesus faced these same temptations for us at the end of His 40 days fasting in the desert. (*Matt 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, Luke 4:1-12*) The devil tempts Him to satisfy His hunger and turn stones into bread—battle with the *flesh*. Next Satan challenges Jesus to cast Himself down from the pinnacle of the temple in Jerusalem to find out if God will save Him. This is a temptation towards power—*worldly* power. Finally, he promises Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if He will bow down and worship him. This is the direct temptation to yield to the *devil*. Like Jesus, we will experience these three temptations. Like Jesus, we can overcome them...*with His grace*!

Lent is a time of strong grace. It is a dramatic season, a call to fight for our souls and for the glory of God. In "The Liturgical Year" by Dom Prosper Guéranger, O.S.B., it states that "it is of the utmost importance that our hearts be spirited and brave..." during our Lenten observance. Yes, the battle is before us. But what a prize awaits us at the end! The victory of the Cross and Resurrection will be ours if we are faithful. They are worth striving for!

It can be easy to view Lent as a negative thing, full only of denial and suffering. Those are indeed elements of Lent. However, they are the means, not the end. It is important to keep in mind the reason for our practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. By turning away from the things of the world, the flesh, and the devil, we turn *towards God*. By emptying ourselves, we open up our souls to be filled...*with God!* If Lent is a challenge to grow stronger, we know God will provide the corresponding grace. Let us begin this season with joy and with courage. We do not fight alone. Our God is with us, and we know the battle is already won!
