

St. Mary's winter weather policy

The Rite of Investiture By Sister Paige

As you read this, Sister Margaret and I will be on a silent retreat in preparation for our investiture as novices which will take place at a Holy Mass on Saturday, March 3rd. A special day calls for special preparation. Like Jesus, Who went out to the desert in solitude to pray and fast prior to beginning His public ministry, we are asking Our Lord to prepare us for this new way of life and vocation to be His brides.

The Holy Mass that day will be a Solemn High Mass. It will begin with a procession which will include the clergy and servers as well as Sister Margaret and I. We will be dressed as brides and carrying lit candles. The bridal attire is rich in symbolism. It reminds us and those present for the rite, that we are being called to be espoused to Christ as our Bridegroom. It also harkens back to the blessed day of our Baptism when we were clothed in a white garment. A religious vocation (or a married vocation) bring the graces received at Baptism to their fullness. Similarly, the lit candle reminds us of the candles we received at Baptism. That candle, lit from the Easter candle, represents the Light of the World—Christ's life in our souls. The parable from the gospels about the 10 virgins (5 wise and 5 foolish) who wait with their lamps to greet the Bridegroom, is also recalled. Traditionally, the oil which allowed the 5 wise virgins to keep their lamps burning symbolizes charity.

The Holy Mass will proceed as usual until after Holy Communion. At that time, the rite of investiture will take place. Sister Margaret and I will come forward into the sanctuary where Father Matthew will be seated. He will ask us (in Latin) what we are seeking. Our response will be, "Reverend Father, I ask you, for the love of God and of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to deign to admit me to the dignity of wearing the habit, to offer myself entirely to Jesus through Mary as a *Labor Mariae* daughter and to participate in Our Lady's labors for the salvation of souls." This summarizes the mission of our community. Next, Father will cut our hair. This beautiful sacrificial act symbolizes that we are giving ourselves completely to Jesus, including any physical beauty we may have. After our hair is cut, we will leave the sanctuary and enter the sacristy. When we return, we will have changed from our bridal attire into the simple tunic we wear as part of our habit. We will then receive the additional pieces of our religious habit including the cincture (belt), 7 Sorrows Rosary, scapular and collar, and a white veil. We will also be presented with the breviary which is the book containing the Psalms that make up the Divine Office that we pray each day. This will now be a solemn obligation for us to perform.

At this point Father will also announce our new religious names. There are many instances in Scripture recounting a person receiving a new name along with a new calling from God. We can recall Abram becoming Abraham, Simon becoming Peter, or Saul becoming Paul. This is the rationale for receiving a new name upon formally entering religious life. It marks a deepening of our Baptismal calling and a closer identification with Christ. Sister Margaret and I were able to suggest names we felt might be a good fit for us, but ultimately the decision lies with The Holy Spirit working through Sister M. Regina!

After the rite is complete, the Holy Mass will conclude as usual and we will process out of the church, again carrying our lit candles. We hope to greet you outside of the church and in Fitzgerald Hall afterwards on this very exciting day! Please pray for us and be assured of our very grateful prayers for all of you!

"The Sisters are making their annual silent eight day retreat from February 22nd until March 2nd. For that reason, they will not pray Vespers in public on February 27th, 28th and March 1st. Be assured that the Sisters will remember all the intentions of Saint Mary's Parish and the parishioners in their prayers during retreat. Please pray for the Sisters, that they may make a good retreat. Thank you!"

MUSIC NOTES ~ Welcome to Lent! Like other liturgical seasons, there are some new things happening in the liturgy, meant to enrich our spiritual lives. At St. Mary's, we have a few seasonal changes that you may have noticed last week, and I wanted to take a moment to address them. As always, if there are any questions about liturgy or music please feel free to ask me after Mass, or email me!

Firstly, we are singing only the Introit (the Entrance Antiphon) at the beginning of Mass. This is to enter a more somber period of Lent, and to practice singing the antiphons as a congregation. This works just like the Responsorial Psalm, so please sing the refrain along with me! The music is found in the red Missals (the page number and refrain number are in the bulletin) or you can just find the text printed in the bulletin or in your Missal right before the readings for the day! (Please let me know if this is confusing!) Please sing along to the Introit at any point in the year!

Secondly, we are singing the hymns a cappella. The term 'a cappella' means 'as in the chapel', and is very fitting for sacred music. 'Fasting' from the organ is a good reminder of the penitential season of Lent, and when we reach Easter, we can pull out all the stops! Please know that if we sing a cappella, that doesn't mean that it's only the time for me or the choir to sing-join in!

- 3) We are singing the Credo at 11am Mass, and hope to continue this practice after Lent, as well! The music can be found in the red Missals on pg. 896, along with the translations. Credo I is pretty repetitive, so do try to sing along!
- 4) Please sing along to the Communio at 5pm and 8am Masses, just like the Introit! This goes for any time of the year! Of course, if the choir is singing it in Latin at 11am, you don't have the music, but can find the translation in your red Missals!
- 5) We are not having a recessional hymn after Mass, besides the Marian Antiphon (which we sing to honor Our Lady as our patroness), but instead are praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet (pg. 1032 in the Missal). This is a very short devotion-only about 5 minutesand all are invited to stay and pray together.
- 6) You also may have noticed the melody changed for the Ordinary of the Mass at 5pm and 11am. This is the traditional chant Mass for Sundays of Advent and Lent, and we will sing it until Easter, then hear it again in Advent. It is simple, but a bit more complex than the Missa Simplex which we sing at 8am Mass. ~ Praying that you all have a fruitful and blessed Lent!
