This week we contemplate—in anticipation—the feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ, which we will celebrate this year on Sunday, June 3rd. This feast is peculiar among the feasts of the church because it is one of the few feasts on which there is traditionally a Eucharistic procession.

What is a Eucharistic procession, you may ask? It is a procession (I suppose you could think of it as a very solemn parade) in which the Eucharistic Lord, Jesus, is brought out among His people, treated with the greatest solemnity and given the highest honors we can muster, to show our love, gratitude and respect for Him. Mind you, it is not a parade for us, but a kingly procession in honor of Him who is our benefactor *par excellence*. As with a festival parade, military ceremony or any formal celebration of good and beautiful things we love and respect, we desire to give Jesus a display of honor and praise, but in an even more solemn fashion, of course.

Since it is a beautiful and moving description, and since St. Jean-Marie Vianney is one of the patron saints depicted in our Sanctuary, I thought I would share an excerpt of what Corpus Christi was like in the little town of Ars under the leadership of St. Jean-Marie Vianney, as described by a pilgrim visitor.

I beheld an immense procession formed of pilgrims from all parts advancing into the fields in the wake of divers banners. Every minute there was an explosion of artillery, which was answered by a detonation from the direction of the chateau on the opposite side of the valley. The procession advances—the canopy of cloth of gold, the silver-gilt monstrance, the copes of brocade reflect the rays of the sun that dart between the branches of the big trees. An aged priest, the venerable cure of the place, advances, carries the God of all.

Clouds of smoke curl up from the censers. The canopy halts. Two thousand people fall on their knees and bow their heads to the earth whilst, with trembling hand, the priest slowly lifts the monstrance.

The spectacle is reminiscent of the Middle Ages. There is a bridge to cross; it is decorated with banners and festoons of flaming hues. The triangular pennons of the house of Ars flap in the breeze...There are fewer grains in the sanded paths than there are rose-petals strewn by pious hands. (The Cure D'Ars St. Jean-Marie Baptiste Vianney, by Abbe Francis Trochu, p228) It is said (in the same book):

When he was in the company of other priests, [St. Jean-Marie Vianney] usually sought the last place, but on this day he would not yield to another the honor of carrying the Blessed Sacrament. Walking under the canopy given by the Vicomte d-Ars, and clad in sumptuous vestments, he advanced with majesty that impressed the beholders. With his eyes steadily fixed on the Host, he prayed and wept.

I would like to invite you to attend the Corpus Christi procession in honor of our Lord on **Sunday, June 3rd, after the 11:00 AM Mass.** If you do not usually attend the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday, you could certainly come around 12 Noon, and join us for the procession, which will begin shortly thereafter. I <u>invite</u> you not because it is "invitation only" but as a reminder of the wonderful opportunity we have of expressing our gratitude to the Lord in this beautiful manner!

I also invite each of you (or each family) to bring a bouquet of flowers to the procession on Corpus Christi Sunday, as an expression of your gratitude for the "bouquet" of God's graces and generosities in your life. Since bouquets are a sign of affection, gratitude and love, let each of us use it as our sign of affection and gratitude for our Lord, Who loves us so much! Nothing, no gesture of ours, can be "too much" to give to our Lord! The Cure of Ars, whose deep affection for the Holy Eucharist knew no bounds, settled for nothing less than the very best of everything for the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Let us take this great saint as an example and do everything we can to make this procession as beautiful as possible. Invite your families; invite your neighbors! Wear your Sunday best, and bring bouquets of flowers for Christ the King!

This feast and this procession is one of the Church's very public and very concrete acts of faith in the Eucharistic presence of Jesus. He is with us! He walks among us! It is a celebration, but it is also a prayer of thanksgiving and praise for this immense act of Love that is God in our midst. As the entire town of Ars came to a halt to celebrate the Lord on this day, let all of us prepare ourselves and our church to celebrate this feast with greater festivity than ever before! Let us stop at nothing to make this the best Corpus Christi procession this town has ever seen!


