May Devotion By Sister Joanna Marie, L.M.

Welcome to the month of May! Have you looked around outside lately? Isn't it *beautiful*? Despite the stubborn snowflakes we experienced just a few weeks ago, the trees are finally blossoming and living things of all kinds are beginning to sprout up shyly from the ground. The other sisters and I have enjoyed some time working in our garden and are so grateful for the beautiful days God has blessed us with. As sisters dedicated to Mary, this is one of our favorite months! The Church encourages all her children to honor Our Lady throughout this beautiful month. In 1815, Pope Pius VII granted that any of the faithful who honor the Blessed Virgin Mary with some special homage and devout prayers, or practice virtuous acts, either in public or private, may receive a partial indulgence every day of the month and a plenary indulgence on one day of the month or on one of the first 8 days of June. Let's gather those graces!

Here are some suggestions on how to practice May Devotion and honor Our Lady:

1. Attend a May Crowning.

We will have a May crowning in the Mary Garden outside of church on Sunday, May 6th, after the 11:00 a.m. Holy Mass. One of our First Communicants will have the honor of crowning Our Lady! If you aren't able to make it that day, why not hold your own May Crowning at home? You could do it very simply or make it a festive celebration and invite your family and friends! The most important thing is to honor Mary with your prayers.

2. Pray the Rosary

If you already pray the rosary each day, May is a great time to deepen your devotion to it. An excellent way to do this is by reading scripture references to the mysteries and meditating on them. You could also invite friends to pray the rosary with you. If you don't pray the rosary daily, May is a perfect time to start! Perhaps you could begin with one decade a day, which takes just a few minutes. You will be amazed at the graces Our Lady pours out on you through this simple prayer!

3. Decorate Images of Mary

Along with crowning a statue, try keeping fresh flowers near an image of Our Lady in your home (or garden). Drape some beautiful fabric around a picture or statue. Pearls, ribbon, candles...get creative! Nothing is too beautiful for Mary. We are both soul and body. Visual reminders help feed our prayer life as we pay homage to Our Lady this month.

4. Begin wearing the Miraculous Medal and Brown Scapular

These sacramentals, when worn with devotion, bring rich graces into our lives and are further reminders that Our Mother is always watching out for us.

5. Learn something new about Our Lady

Read a book about Our Lady. Try praying the Rosary of the 7 Sorrows or some other devotional prayer to Mary that you've never experienced before (ask the sisters or Father for suggestions!). Pray the Litany of Loreto which will teach you many beautiful titles for Our Lady.

These are just a few ideas. The possibilities are endless. Happy Month of Mary!


PARISH PENTECOST PICNIC
