

## Dear Parishioners of Saint Mary's,

During the last three weeks of June, I will be away from Saint Mary's for my annual days of vacation. I am happy to let you know that I have been able to find priests to offer Holy Mass, not only on Sundays, but even during the week. All the weekday Masses will be offered in the Extraordinary Form. The regular schedule of adoration will continue during my absence, as well.

Having the Extraordinary Form offered three weeks in a row provides a great way to get more familiar with the older form, since sometimes it takes getting used to. I would like to encourage any boys that would like to learn how to serve the Latin Mass to attend daily Mass during those weeks. Benjamin Armentraut, the seminarian that is with us for the summer, will have practices with the servers during those weeks. The following priests will be at St. Mary's during my absence:

Father Sean Kopczynski, a member of the Missionaries of Saint John the Baptist (from the Diocese of Covington) will be at Saint Mary's from June 12<sup>th</sup> through June 17<sup>th</sup>. Not only will he be available for confession before the Noon Mass, but he will also offer a series of sermons about the Holy Mass during his weekday Masses. In the evenings, at 6:00 P.M., he will offer Our Lady of Lourdes Catechism Classes. Please take advantage of Father Sean's presence at the parish by attending his presentations and by inviting others to join you!

On Saturday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, Father Sean will offer the Saturday morning Mass I have been offering at 7:30 A.M.

Father Cassian DiRocco, a member of the Contemplatives of Saint Joseph (from the Archdiocese of San Francisco), will be at Saint Mary's from June 19<sup>th</sup> through June 23<sup>rd</sup>. Father will be available for confession before Holy Mass. The weekday Masses will be offered at the usual time of 12:00 Noon, and the Saturday morning Mass will be offered at 7:30 A.M. Father Alex Kreidler and Father Andrew Mattingly will offer the weekday Masses from June 25<sup>th</sup> until June 29<sup>th</sup>. The Holy Mass will not be at 12:00 Noon, that week, but at 8:00 A.M.

I am deeply grateful to the priests who are able to provide for you, the parishioners of Saint Mary's, during the weeks of my absence.

This Sunday's 11:00 A.M. Mass will be followed immediately by a Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession. Each family's has been invited to bring a bouquet of flowers for our Eucharistic Lord. The flowers will be used to decorate the altar of Benediction (in front of the rectory). Coffee & juices, donuts & pastries, and fresh fruit will be provided by our Welcome Committee and will be served in Mary's Garden after the procession. Everyone is most welcome to join us!

Holy Communion increases our union with Christ and with his Church. It preserves and renews the life of grace received at Baptism and Confirmation and makes us grow in love for our neighbor. It strengthens us in charity, wipes away venial sins and preserves us from mortal sin in the future.

Catholics believe that the presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host and Precious Blood as long as they remain unconsumed and intact. For this reason, all of the Precious Blood is consumed during the Mass. Any remaining hosts are placed in the tabernacle, a beautiful box that reminds us of the tabernacle of the Old Testament where God visited his people. Today, Jesus waits for us in tabernacles throughout the world. He has given us a wonderful gift in his enduring presence in the Holy Eucharist and invites us to visit him often to find peace in his presence and give him our adoration and thanks.
