

July: Month of the Most Precious Blood By Sister Joanna Marie, L.M.

The brilliant colors of fireworks will soon light the night sky as we celebrate a great date in the history of our country on July 4th. It is on this day that we are reminded to be thankful for our nation's independence (in case the name of our town doesn't remind us each day!). As we savor our freedom as Americans, let us also take some time to ponder a gift even more spectacular—our freedom as children of holy Mother Church and of God redeemed by the Most Precious Blood of Jesus Christ!

Holy Mother Church has consecrated not just one day, but the entire month of July, to the mystery of the Most Precious Blood. In the calendar used in the Extraordinary Form of the Sacred Liturgy, the month opens with the wonderful Feast of the Most Precious Blood. Here at Saint Mary's, we will be blessed to celebrate this with a *Missa Solemnis* (Solemn High Mass) at 5:00 p.m. this Sunday, July 1st.

The month of June was dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It was on Good Friday that this Sacred Heart, burning with love, poured out every drop of His Most Precious Blood to redeem us. In June we also celebrated the beautiful feast of Corpus Christi, the great festival of the Blessed Sacrament. In his reflections on the liturgical year Dom Prosper Guéranger, O.S.B., says: "How is it, then, that holy Church is now inviting all Christians to hail, in a particular manner, the stream of life ever gushing from that sacred fount? What else can this mean, but that the preceding solemnities have by no means exhausted the mystery?" Indeed, the mystery of the Holy Eucharist is something we can *never exhaust!*

Blood was an important part of the Old Covenant. We remember how at the Passover the Jewish people were not only to eat the flesh of the Passover lamb, but also to mark their doorposts with its blood (see Exodus, Chap. 12). This is a "type" or prefiguring of the Eucharist in Its two species. In the Epistle read for the Feast of the Most Precious Blood, Saint Paul says: "Brethren, Christ being come a High Priest of the good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle not made with hands, that is, no of this creation, neither by the blood of goats or of calves, but by His own Blood, entered once into the Holies, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and of oxen, and the ashes of an heifer being sprinkled, sanctify such as are defiled, to the cleansing of the flesh, how much more shall the Blood of Christ, Who through the Holy Ghost, offered Himself without spot to God, cleans our conscience from dead works to serve the living God? And therefore, He is the Mediator of the New Testament; that by means of His death, for the redemption of those transgressions which were under the former Testament, those that are called may receive the promise of eternal inheritance; in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Hebrews 9:11-15).

On Good Friday, the Church stood at the foot of the Cross in mourning. This month, She stands there with triumph in Her Heart! Why this sentiment of exaltation? The Church Fathers teach us that when the Precious Blood flowed forth from the side of Christ, His Bride the Church was born. Just as it was from the side of the first man, Adam, that his bride Eve, was given life. Jesus is the New Adam and we are the New Eve—the Church.

We are also reminded of the beautiful Divine Mercy image in which rays of red and white issue forth from the resurrected Lord's pierced side. The red represents His Eucharist, including His Precious Blood. The white represents the waters of Baptism. One of the prayers Jesus taught Saint Faustina says: "O Blood and water which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of mercy for us, I trust in You."

A blessed month of July to each of you! May we thank Jesus each day for the freedoms we enjoy as Americans, but even more so for those He has made available to all people in the world who take refuge in the brilliant stream of His Most Precious Blood!
