### Keeping all these things in our hearts....By Sister M. Regina

At a Low Mass, we have been kneeling for the prayers at the foot of the altar, and we remain kneeling as the priest ascends the altar. After the priest has kissed the altar and the relic contained in the altar stone, he goes to the right side of the altar. He makes the Sign of the Cross, which we make with him, and reads a short verse called the *Introit*.

The *Introit* is the entrance antiphon, which we also have in the Ordinary Form. Like the Entrance Antiphon, the *Introit* serves as a type of very brief introduction to the Holy Mass and the particular feast or votive Mass being offered that day. You will not find the *Introit* in the red booklets available in church, because the red booklets contain only the unchangeable parts of the Holy Mass. The *Introit* is proper to each Mass and it be found in a Missal. The week indicates which Holy Mass is being celebrated (be it of a saint or a ferial day).

Having prayed the *Introit*, the priest returns to the middle of the altar. Already at the foot of the altar, the priest, and we with him, have asked for God's mercy, especially in praying the *Confiteor* (I confess to almighty God...). We return again to that theme, now, in the prayer of the *Kyrie*, in which we again beg God to have mercy upon us. The *Kyrie* in the Extraordinary Form of the Holy Mass is structured differently from the same rite in the Ordinary Form. In the Ordinary Form, we repeat twice the *Kyrie*, then twice the *Christe*, then twice the *Kyrie*. In the Extraordinary Form, we repeat each group *three* times in honor of the Blessed Trinity. First, we address God the Father three times, praying "*Kyrie, eléison.*" Then, we address God the Son three times, praying "*Christe, eléison.*" Finally, we address God the Holy Spirit three times, praying "*Kyrie, eléison.*" When there is a server, we silently join our voices to his, as he alternates with the priest in praying the *Kyrie*. When there is no server, then we may respond to the priest, but we must be careful: Since each invocation is repeated thrice, it means that we do not always repeat what the priest says! The red booklet indicates what our response is to the *Kyrie* invocations.

Whenever the Holy Mass is of a Sunday or when a saint is being commemorated, which is most often the case, the priest next intones the hymn of joy in which we exalt God's majesty, the *Gloria*. In sung Masses, the choir sings the *Gloria*, but in Low Masses, the priest recites it and we silently join in his prayer. The *Gloria* begins with the words of the Angels of Christmas who announced the good news to the shepherds: "Glory to God in the highest" (*Lk* 2:14). At the beginning of the Holy Mass, Holy Mother Church sets the tone: the entire hymn is a contemplation of the majestic beauty and goodness of God: we praise Him, we glorify Him, we give Him thanks.

Having completed the *Gloria*, the priest kisses the altar because he is preparing to turn his back for a moment to Jesus Christ present in the tabernacle and symbolized by the altar. He turns to the people and says: "*Dominus vobiscum*" ("The Lord be with you."), to which the server, or we when there is no server, responds, "*Et cum spiritu tuo.*" The salutation is borrowed from the Old Testament (*Ruth* 2:4 and 2 *Chronicles* 15:2). By this salutation, it seems that the priest is inviting us to join our hearts to his, as it were, in the prayer which is to follow, namely, the Collect. The "*Dominus vobiscum*" is repeated eight times in Holy Mass and we are familiar with it from the Ordinary Form, as well.

Turning back to the altar, the priest moves to the right side, where the Missal is found at that time, and prays the Collect out loud. If you have a Missal, you will be able to read the English translation of the prayer. Since the Collect is proper to each Holy Mass, it is not provided in the red booklets. The word "collect" is taken from the Latin word *colligere*, which means to gather up. The intention of the Collect is to gather the intentions of the feast being celebrated and to offer these intentions to our heavenly Father.

Having prayed the Collect, we will listen to the Scripture readings. The first reading is called the "Epistle," even if that reading is not in every case taken from one of the New Testament Epistles. Until this time, we had been kneeling, and we now sit to listen to listen to God's Word. Unlike the Ordinary Form, in which the first reading is always from the Old Testament, the Epistle can be taken from one of the New Testament Epistles, from the Acts of the Apostles, from the Book of Revelation or from the Old Testament. The Missal provides the English translation of the reading, which is typically read in Latin. Since the promulgation of the *Motu Proprio Summorum Pontificum* in 2007, priests are permitted to read the Epistle and the Gospel in the vernacular (Cf. *Summorum Pontificum*, § 5, Art. 6), as Father Matthew Bartulica typically does at the Low Masses in the Extraordinary Form at Saint Mary's.

### Basic Catholic Catechism Course

The purpose of the Marian Catechist Apostolate is to form catechists, both spiritually and doctrinally, for the teaching of the Catholic faith. The formation of Marian Catechists has two components corresponding to the twofold purpose: it is both doctrinal and spiritual. The doctrinal formation consists of four levels of courses, beginning with the *Basic Catholic Catechism Course*, written by Father John A. Hardon, S.J.

**We will begin a study group for the *Basic Catholic Catechism Course* at Saint Mary's, beginning after the Labor Day Weekend.** The proposed day and time are Wednesdays at 10:15 A.M., to coincide with the time of the proposed Catechesis of the Good Shepherd classes for children. If those who are interested in the study group are unable to meet at the proposed time, we can adjust the day and time. Each participant will need to purchase several books to use for study. A registration form with additional information for the study group will soon be available at the south vestibule of church.
