



Keeping all these things in our hearts....By Sister M. Regina

Beginning next month, we will be offering the sixteen-lesson *Basic Catholic Catechism Home Study Course* study group on Sundays from 9:00 until 10:30 A.M. (the same time as P.S.R., catechesis for children). Sign up sheets are available at the entrances to the church. The *Basic Catholic Catechism Course* covers the essential truths of the Catholic Faith in a systematic and comprehensive way. The text of the Manual was written by the Servant of God Father John A. Hardon, S.M., and was updated and revised by His Eminence Raymond Leo Cardinal Burke. The study group for the challenging home study course is open to anyone (ages 16 and up) who has a desire to better understand what we believe as Catholics.

The Basic Catholic Catechism Course includes both a Manual, containing the text, and a Workbook, containing questions. Both items will need to be purchased, in order to participate in the course. They may be obtained at the following website address: <u>https://mariancatechist.com/product/basic-catholic-catechism-course/</u> The price for a complete set of books, which includes the Manual, Workbooks, a paperback Catechism of the Catholic Church, and an invaluable Modern Catholic Dictionary, is \$65. The entire course can also be completed on-line.

The typical format for a meeting of the study group will be that we review the questions based on a given lesson. In preparation for the meeting, each participant has studied the lesson and responded to the questions. In the context of going over the correct answers to the questions in the Workbook, there typically arise some questions of clarification which leads to a discussion.

The completion of the *Basic Catechism Course* is a necessary first step in becoming a Marian Catechist, although anyone may take the course without becoming a Marian Catechist. It is my hope, though, that our parish will have some Marian Catechists in the near future. The Marian Catechist Apostolate was founded by the Servant of God Father John A. Hardon, S.J. The Apostolate had its roots in a request which Saint Teresa of Calcutta made to Father Hardon, namely, that he help to prepare her Sisters to evangelize the poorest of the poor. Father Hardon gave classes to the Missionaries of Charity and these classes were the basis for the Marian Catechist Apostolate course.

The purpose of the Marian Catechist Apostolate is to form catechists, both spiritually and doctrinally, for the teaching of the Catholic faith. The formation of Marian Catechists has two components corresponding to the twofold purpose: it is both doctrinal and spiritual. The doctrinal formation consists of four levels of courses which a person takes, beginning with the *Basic Catholic Catechism Course*, written by Father John A. Hardon. The spiritual formation of the Marian Catechist consists in fidelity to the spiritual practices prescribed for Marian Catechists and the making of a thirty day at-home Ignatian retreat.

The doctrinal and spiritual formation of Marian Catechists culminate in the Solemn Consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The act of consecration is renewed each year and is a source of grace for the catechist. In making the consecration, the catechist makes a commitment to be faithful for one year to the spiritual practices of the Marian Catechist, to continue to study the faith, and to perform some type of catechetical or apostolic service. The catechetical or apostolic service required of Marian Catechists is not restricted to the teaching of catechesis at the parish. Catechetical work may include the teaching of one's own children or grandchildren at home, the writing of catechetical texts (such as the present one), etc. If anyone would like to assist in teaching at the Parish School of Religion, please contact the Sisters.
