PASTOR'S CORNER

2nd Sunday After Epiphany or Ordinary Time?

This Sunday, we celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. (If you are wondering what happened to the First Sunday, it was last week. The Baptism of the Lord is always celebrated on the First Sunday, and because of the way the calendar falls this year, we celebrated the Baptism of the Lord on Monday.). This marks a time in the calendar that is more normal. It reminds us that there is a regular rhythm and flow to life at times. We fall into routines and habits. There is a certain sense of stability and an ability to relax. This is a very good thing. There is a beauty to our life itself, without the need to add highlights and grand events. It reminds us that there is great blessing in the ordinary. Yet at the same time, we remember that there are times for grand events and special celebrations, and there are even times when struggles and hardships come, and we long for life to get back to normal (this is Advent and Lent).

Coming into Ordinary Time is actually something very new for the Church. It has been only for about 50 years that we have named the calendar this way; it is a product of Vatican II. For Centuries prior to that, this was always the Time After Epiphany. Today was described as the Second Sunday After Epiphany. The Church marked time by looking at our relationship to the grand events and celebrations. It was not so much that we would recall how long has passed since these events, but that time is sanctified and directed by them, and that they leave their mark. So that during these weeks, we are effected by, and think more about the continuing Epiphany of the Lord. In this way we are also drawn back into the eternal nature of Christ and the Divine Life. Epiphany, Easter and Pentecost did not last only 1 day.

The question then often comes: Which way is better? Or, most others would say that they are simply different and equally good, according to whichever way someone prefers. I disagree with both of these ways. It is neither that one is better than the other, or that they are simply different. Rather, they are both necessary and truly good, and are not the only calendars of the Church.

A typical practice for the Eastern Catholic Churches (not the Orthodox), is to mark the more ordinary Sundays such as *Peter Sunday, Sunday of the Leper*, or *Cheese Fair*. They are referencing at times the Gospel reading for the day or a major Church action. For them, the calendar is named after what is happening in the Church. This also is necessary.

Each of these ways reveals another facet of the relationship between God, time, the Church and life in the world. These are *Mysteries* so great, that no single way of naming our days is sufficient, but God has given them all to us to deepen our understanding and reveal more to us.

So . . . Sunday is the 2nd Sunday after Epiphany **and** the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time **and** the Sunday of Zacchaeus.
