

INTRODUCTORY PRAYER

O most watchful guardian of the Son of God, glorious Saint Joseph, great was your toil in supporting and waiting upon the Son of God, especially during the flight into Egypt! Yet, how you rejoiced to have God himself always near you. By this sorrow and this joy, obtain for us the grace that would keep us safe from the devil, especially the help we need to flee from dangerous situations. May we serve Jesus and Mary, and for them alone may we live and happily die.

GOSPEL READING | MATTHEW 2:13 - 15 REFLECTION

"Joseph's faith does not falter, he obeys quickly and to the letter. To understand this lesson better, we should remember that Joseph's faith is active, that his docility is not passive submission to the course of events. For the Christian's faith has nothing whatever to do with conformity, inertia or lack of initiative.

"Joseph entrusted himself unreservedly to the care of God, but he always reflected on events and so was able to reach that level of understanding of the works of God which is true wisdom. In this way he learned little by little that supernatural plans have a logic which at times upsets human plans." (*Christ is Passing By*, no. 42).

PASTOR'S CORNER



New Things at St. Mary's:

I typically want to reserve this space for commentary and highlighting an aspect of the Scripture readings for Sunday, or for a part of the Holy Mass. With 5 pages of bulletin space for the parish calendar, announcements and prayers, the Sacred Scriptures deserve at least this much time and space. With the closure of St. Ann's, there are a number of things appearing in the church and projects for the building that I want to share with you.

The first thing that many have likely noticed is a statue of St. Ann in the baptistry. This was a statue from the old school at St. Ann's, many of our parishioners have memories of touching her feet as they walked by. It was also recently restored and repainted by one of St. Ann's long parishioners who not only did beautiful work, but has given a long lasting gift to the Church.

There are also the new arrival of two maybe holy water fonts, these are also from St. Ann's. While they remain empty as part of the long tradition of removing Holy Water during the desert of Lent, they will long serve as a reminder of our Baptism in Christ and al of those who were baptized at St. Ann's.

We have brought over an Urn and placed it in the Adoration Chapel. This looks like a tabernacle, but with handles for carrying and is the proper place of reserve for the Blessed Sacrament during the Triduum.

The acoustic paneling will be installed beginning on April 10th and the installation of new sound equipment will happen shortly afterward.

Lastly, I want to share that thanks to the generous donation of an anonymous donor, we are having a custom ambry built. The Ambry is the cabinet where the Holy Oils are kept. It is typically located near the baptistry and is scheduled to be installed during Holy Week-ready to receive the Holy Oils for next year. Here is an image of what the ambry will look like.
