

A Marian hymn is sung each night, at the conclusion of Compline (night prayer) in this way, the Church ends the day by serenading and giving thanks to our Blessed Mother. Traditionally, this hymn changes to reflect the major liturgical seasons. From Easter Sunday to Pentecost, we sing *Regina Caeli*. Regina caeli laetare, alleluia: Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.

Quia quem meruisti portare, alleluia: For He whom thou wast worthy to bear, alleluia.

Resurrexit, sicut dixit, alleluia: Hath risen, as He said, alleluia. Ora pro nobis Deum, alleluia. Pray for us to God, alleluia.

## Pastor's Corner

#### The Resurrected Body:

One of the shows I watch from time to time is Star Gate. It's admittedly not a particularly good show, but it's safe to watch and entertaining at times. As the main characters explore the galaxy they run into strange places and the seemingly invincible enemy. And like most good stories, there runs a constant thread of the human desire for advancement, to reach our greatest human potential. This remains a question for us: What is our greatest human potential? In one episode, one of the characters contracts an incurable disease, and the only way that he can survive to learn how to transcend to a higher plane of consciousness, where he escapes the constraints of his physical body. They call this, Ascension, that one has reached a new level of evolution and been freed from the physical body.

Indeed, throughout human history, we have struggled against the heresy of Gnosticism and dualism that pits the flesh and spirit against one another, as though we are spiritual beings trapped in physical bodies. While this is a battle that takes place, it is a battle between a fallen world, a corrupted flesh and the desire to return to holiness.

The resurrection of our Lord, in a body that could be seen and touched, and one that even eats food, shows us that the body is not fundamentally evil and opposed to God. We are not spiritual beings trapped in a physical body, but spiritual beings in union with a physical body.

The Resurrection of the Body reveals the perfection of the body, which is to say, if you remove all of the corruptions, the sin, the impurities, and weaknesses that limit us from being fully human, you have a human body that ascends to heaven. In other words, our bodies are part of God's plan of salvation and essential to who we are. They are intended to be Holy, which is, to be set aside and directed to God. Our bodies are deeply, and essentially connected to our spirit such that how we treat our bodies, is how we treat or spirit, and vice versa. This is why if we direct our spiritual life toward God, it helps to bring our physical bodies also closer to him. We do not seek to escape and flee from our body, but to perfect it.

This, of course, has led some to fall into the other trap, which is a greater worship of the body and to seek perfection through perfect muscular tone, shape and physical health. Some will judge the holiness and moral character of others, based on their physical appearance. And yet, we know this also not to be true. Again, we go to the fundamental truth: We are spiritual beings united with a physical body. Perfection is found in union. That the spirit and body be in communion with one another.
