



PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace be with you.

These are the first words of Jesus to the disciples, after his resurrection. As they were gathered in the upper room, as the Gospel of John tells us, they had locked the door "for fear of the Jews." His next sentence is equally telling. He repeats himself, "Peace be with you," but then adds, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

Notice that he did not offer any other words of encouragement. Nor did he give an apology and explanation that the Jews were not coming after them. He did not tell them how to escape. He did not even give them any instruction about his resurrection. Rather, in the face of this fear, he immediately tells them that he is sending them out just as he, the one who had been arrested and crucified, had been sent.

The resurrection is the ultimate sign that there is nothing to fear, there is no reason to be afraid. Often times, when we face a situation that causes us fear, anxiety or nervousness, we try to calm ourselves by convincing ourselves that everything is going to be alright; everything is going to work out. If we are nervous about giving a speech we may practice the speech over and over again, or be told to imagine the people dressed in a humorous way. If we are moving to a new home, or going away to college, people may try to calm our fears by telling us how much we will enjoy where we are going, or how we will meet new people and make new friends. In other words, we try to calm our fear by focusing on where we are going and what is going to happen to us.

Jesus tells us different: Peace be with you . . . because I am sending you. That is all we need to know. If you follow me, then as my Father sent me into the world to do His will, so I am sending you. And if I am telling you to go out, then I would not be telling you to go to your death; I would not be sending you out to anything that is worthy of your fear.

Peace in the midst of fear and unsettledness comes from faith in the one who is sending us, not in becoming comfortable with the results. Keep your focus on the one who is behind you, who propels you forward and is guiding you. And the one who propels you forward has just revealed to you why the Father sent him into the worldwhat awaits those who follow him.

The Resurrection is the reason he was sent into the world, and so, he sent the disciples so that they too could participate in the resurrection. This is why they should no longer be afraid and should be at peace. It is why we should be at peace, even in the face of the fear of losing one's parish; in the face of confusion, uncertainty and even anger. It is not a matter of saying that everything will be okay, and you will find new friends, but of faith in the resurrection and the certainty of His victory and promise of life. Be at peace, because of the one who is sending you.
