# PASTOR'S CORNER

#### **ONE FLOCK/ONE PASTURE:**

This Sunday, we are reminded again that our God is our Shepherd, and His Son is the way, or the Gate, into His pasture. It is a single pasture. It may at times seem divided, whether by groups within the flock that want to separate themselves out, or look at others as not worthy of being part of the flock; or we may go as far to set up fences and gates to distinguish what is ours from what is theirs. As Fr. Mike Schmitz has often said: The thing about being Catholic is that there is no *them*. It is always *us* and *we*.

Truly, if the Lord is our Shepherd, we have entered through His Gate, and are in His pasture, then then we are naturally one flock.

With the amalgamation of St. Joseph the Worker and St. Ann's with St. Mary's (and of St. Cyril's coming in the next year) we are being reminded of this in a real and tangible way. And as we know from our own lives and spiritual journey, this perfect unity doesn't not occur overnight. For most of us, it literally takes a lifetime. It's not simply because we are stubborn and slow of wit (which we are), but growth also simply takes time--it is the way of nature and shown to us through the mustard seed. In this light, I would like to share a few practical things regarding the coming together of the parishes:

#### Windows at St. Ann's

Bishop Johnston has asked that we preserve several of the smaller stained glass windows for the Diocese to use. This includes the Holy Angels and St. Francis windows-Unfortunately, at cost of over \$160,000, it is simply too expensive to remove all of the windows from the church (as it is, it will cost \$25,000 to remove just these). We will, however, be bringing two of the windows to St. Mary's: The Holy Family and Jesus Blesses the Children.

### The Memory Wall

The plaques from the *Memory Wall* were removed. After some time for prayer and reflection, I have decided that we will mount these plaques on a wooden board to eventually be hung in St. Mary's. This will honor and preserve the patronage of St. Ann and those given into her care. If you wold like to contribute to the purchase and installation of this, please contact Fr. Kendall.
