BUILDING AND REPAIRS

CARING FOR ST. MARY'S

The parish *Building Fund* provides for both anticipated and unanticipated repairs that are needed from time to time. This is an important part of our stewardship of the parish. I would like to take a moment to share some of the immediate needs and upcoming repairs.

Leak over the Elevator: The membrane on the roof over the elevator has worn over time and this is causing a worsening leak. The repairs are \$15,000 and set to begin as soon as the weather is clear enough.

Sacristy Leak: After months of investigation, it was determined that the duct work for the HVAC units over the main sacristy is the source of a significant leak. We are awaiting the repair estimate on this, which will likely be \$8,000-12,000.

Driveway Wall: The retaining wall along the driveway was damaged last year when workers took down a dead tree. It has taken a long time to find a process and blocks so the repairs would match the existing wall. Tuck painting and repair to the entire wall is \$10,000.

Building Fund: At present we have \$2,875 in the *building fund* account. We still have to pay \$23,000-28,000 on these repairs.

Pastor's Corner

Vaulting From Easter

Ascension Sunday marks the end of the Easter Season and return to Ordinary Time. It brings to a conclusion the intense celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord, and a return to the ordinary and mundane activities of life. In many ways, we continue to live out the experience of the Apostles who first protested against the Lord leaving and then stood looking to the sky, longing for him to return. It is likely hard for us to truly imagine the weight of the departure. While we have all experienced the departure of someone dear to us and watched them leave when all we wanted was for them to stay, nothing can compare with the the joy of being in the company of the risen Jesus, and the collapsing heart of having him leave.

Moving from Easter to the ordinary is a precipitous drop . . . unless we remember what our Lord also told the Apostles: If I do not go, the Paraclete cannot come. There is a lot of Wisdom in the Church over these next few weeks as we leave Easter and go into the Ordinary, as we face the temptation to think mostly on the abandonment and departing of Christ.

Over the next three Sundays we celebrate Pentecost, the Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of Christ. As the resurrected Lord leaves us, we enter a time of high celebration, and this is the point of the Ascension and his words to the Apostles. Although he is leaving, he is giving to us what we need to engage in the ordinary, mundane and the challenges of bringing the Gospel to the world.

He sends to us the Paraclete, the Advocate and Holy Spirit. The Spirit cannot come if we are holding on too tightly to Christ. This may not make sense at first, but once the Spirit arrives, giving us the gifts of Knowledge, Counsel, Fortitude, Piety and everything else that He offers, we may begin to follow the path that Christ set out for us.

We see also God revealed in the Holy Trinity and in this the fullness of Christ's identity is revealed, and also the role and relationship of the Holy Spirit. Even though we had looked upon the face of the Son of God and seen the Father, in seeing the Holy Trinity, we see God even more clearly and man is brought closer to Him.

And then, in the ordinary, we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, the fullness of the revelation that our Lord did not abandon us and truly leave at the Ascension, but continues to be truly present and at work in the world, even now.

In a way, we are vaulted from Easter, as the Spirit drove us into Lent, to also reveal another part of the Mystery of why he needed to leave. The gift of the Holy Spirit, revelation of the Holy Trinity and presence of the Body and Blood of Christ, is what is needed to raise us, that we may follow him in the Ascension. While Easter is the time of Jesus walking with us here, the Ordinary is when we complete the work of climbing the Mountain to him.
