

THE HOLY EUCHARIST

As the Catechism describes it is: The Sacrament of Sacraments: Source and Summit of our Faith.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Use What You Have Been Given

We are given gifts for a reason, and we always give a gift for a reason. The reasons are many and varied: it can be an expression of love, like for someone's birthday or on an anniversary; we can give to a stranger out of charity to meet their material needs; it can be something that is meant to be useful, like the emergency road kit my Grandmother gave her grandsons when we turned 16; it can even be out of obligation or as a sign of gratitude or congratulations. Mo matter what the gift is, or why it's been given, we can say that every gift is intended to be used—even if that use is a bit of laughter for a joke gift. One of the most hurtful things for a person is to see a valuable gift be put aside and left unused.

On Pentecost, we remember how for the second time, God sent out His greatest gift into the world. The Holy Spirit descended upon and was given to the Disciples. For every Confirmed Catholic, we have been sealed and received the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Once again, we receive the Gift of God's veery self.

Like all gifts, what we have received has a proper use and God did not give them to us in order to be set aside, put away in a box, to gather dust in an inner closet or be ignored.

The gift of the Knowledge of God, the Wisdom of God, Fear of the Lord, Piety, of Understanding, Counsel and of Fortitude. Each of these carry a threefold purpose. First, in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, God has given His very self. Like the cloud that descended on the Tent of Meeting, He has descended upon, filled and come into an eternal meeting with the Church and with us.

Second, the Gift of the Holy Spirit is for our perfection. How much does one gain from receiving Knowledge, Wisdom, Understanding and what amounts to the fullness of everything God has to offer to us. We get to know him in a way that not even Moses and Elijah knew Him; we receive His very strength and love in order to become like Him.

Third, you have received for the salvation of the World, to baptize all nations and proclaim the Gospel to all peoples. The Apostles did not simply gain an interior knowledge and understanding of God and the Resurrection, but began immediately speaking in a language that everyone understood.

The question is: Are you using what you have received of the Holy Spirit? Are you taking the Talents (the gold coins) you have been given them and put them to use for the Kingdom? Or have you taken them, like the wicked servant and stowed them away, where they could not even earn interest? Go forth and use what you have been given.
