PASTOR'S CORNER

Baptized into Love

This Sunday we celebrate the revelation of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. While it would be enough for us to simply stand in awe and wonder at such a Divine revelation, this revelation tells us that He wants more than to simply reveal part of Himself to us. He wants more than for His people to know Him as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob; He wants more than for us to stand with our back toward Him as Moses, or with face covered as did Elijah.

God desires us to know Him completely, fully and ruthfully. He is not a condemning God; He is not the clock maker, long ago setting things in motion; He is not mischievously playing with the lives of men and women; He is not one among many. He is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

He is a Father who created man and woman for the gift of life. The Father who teaches His children the ways of Goodness and Wills that all receive eternal life. He is the Father who gives His children the freedom of Will and longs to pass on His inheritance to them. He does not wish to exact punishment, though He will discipline and admonish those who deny Him, but seeks to give Mercy when it is needed.

God is the Son, who humbly follows the Will of his Father. He gives of His very life, not only through service and the work of His hands, but of His very life itself. He desires to bring healing to the sick and the lame. He shines light on the path that leads to life, and speaks truth, even when we are more comfortable with lies. He seeks to call us friends and that we may be so close as to even lay our head against his breast. He is the Son who seeks to honor His Father and bring others into His Kingdom.

God is the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life. There is no death within Him. He is incessantly and unceasingly poured out always processing and reaching outward for the other. He reserves nothing of Himself for Himself.

But here is the greatest part of the Revelation, which was made in the very beginning. God desires that you become like Him and to love like Him. Love as the Holy Trinity loves. Love as the Father loves and as the Son loves.

Love as the Holy Spirit loves, giving of your very self: the gifts of Knowledge, Understanding, Counsel. To give to others Piety, the love of the love of God, or in our case, we may think of inspiring in others the desire for true greatness and virtue. Not the greatness that the world thinks about, but greatness and abundance of the spirit. And from these gifts come kindness, joy, magnanimity, hope and even faith itself. To love as the Spirit loves, means also to produce like the spirit produces. To return to the Likeness of God, is to Love as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, which is the only true and perfect Love—He has shown us the Way.
