PASTOR'S CORNER

Afraid of the Voice of the Lord

Several years ago, when I was living in Washington, D.C., I was working for a telecommunications startup. Even though I was brought in as a temporary employee, just for a few months, the founder of the company was very impressed that I was always one of the last to leave the office for the day and always happy to come in for overtime on Saturdays. She always commented on my commitment and work ethic. But the reality was, I dreaded the time when I had to go home. I was happy to avoid the roommates I was renting a room from.

In the reading from the Old Testament this Sunday, we again hear the story of Adam and Eve in the Garden, immediately after eating of the tree. As they are in the garden, Adam hears the LORD God and hides. When the LORD God then calls out to him, he responds that he hid because he was afraid. When we are in a state of shame, we become afraid of the voice of the one we love, whether it is God or other people.

The reason why I was working extra hours, and this happened to me at many other times in life, was not virtuous as my bosses thought, because it was an avoidance of what was awaiting. When there is a break in a relationship, we become afraid, like Adam did. And it doesn't need to be a complete break, but even when there is a little tension. When we commit a sin against someone we will often feel a block, something pushing us away from spending time with them. This can be a big thing, like a major argument, or stealing from them, or it can be something small, like how we load the dish washer, when we may not even notice the avoidance in the beginning. Shame, makes us afraid to be in the presence of the other.

This happens frequently in our relationship with God without people realizing what is going on. It's not only about going to church or even spending time in prayer. We may start staying up a little later, watching an extra television show, having an extra drink, or reading a little longer. There may be this unknown reluctance to go to bed. This is often a sign of being afraid of the Lord, the natural result of shame and time to make an examination. It is a sign that there is sin present. Especially at the end of the day, when we quiet down and settle in for sleep, we are drawn into the Lord's presence and we are afraid of the hearing His voice.

Having wronged a person, we want to hide from his presence. But God does not want us to hide, even when we feel most naked and ashamed. When you notice the hesitation or the delays, examine the source, repent, and return to the relationship—there is no need to hide.
