

PADRE PIO MOVIE

After much anticipation, the movie *Padre Pio*, staring Shia Labeouf, was released earlier this month. You may recall that this is the movie that sparked Shia's conversion and coming to the faith. Regrettably,, after having watched the movie, I must say **please do not watch this movie**.

As many began reporting early on, there is a scene of a very disturbing sacrilege against the Blessed Mother, but I am also equally concerned how the overall movie portrays the Church and uses St. Pio as a political vehicle. The Church is depicted in condoning violence against freedom fighters and the blessing of guns that are immediately used for the slaughter of the poor; the greater focus is given to the rise of the socialist party in Italy, and its portrayal as an innocent victim. After viewing, I don't feel any closer in knowing Padre Pio. A minority of the film, maybe one third, was actually about him, rather the point of the movie, to me, seems more about equating the struggle of the socialist party in Italy with the struggle and burden that Padre Pio took on for the love of Christ.



PASTOR'S CORNER

RECEIVING THE

KING OF KINGS

When it comes to the precepts of the Church, those 5 basic obligations of our relationship with God, there is an interesting, yet often overlooked phenomenon. While one is obliged to attend Mass every Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation, one only needs to receive communion once per year. While going to Mass without receiving Communion seems very strange to many of us it points to a fundamental difference between the two ad truth. There is a proper disposition to receiving the Eucharist.

It is not something to be taken for granted. The Eucharist we receive is the Body and Blood of our Lord. It is His real and true presence, and reception of Holy Communion is not a basic human right. That is, by nature of having been born, I do not have a right to receive it, as I have a right to life, and freedom to worship and of speech. It is only by God's grace, the generosity of the Son, and the promises that we receive in Baptism, that we can receive it. His body and blood are gifts, and we have no standing to demand of God to give them to us.

With the availability of Masses and nearby parishes, it can be easy to approach Holy Communion with a mundane and careless attitude. Within 10 minutes of our parish, you can go to Mass every day, and most days have options of going in the morning, at noon or the evening. Most Catholics throughout the world, do not have such an opportunity.

One is not to receive communion if you are in the state of mortal sin, needing confession. If one has not fulfilled any one of the precepts, not gone to confession within the last year, has missed attending Mass on Sunday when able; if one has committed other grave sin; or if one is in a state such as being married outside of the Church or regular use of birth control. Because grave sin has the effect of separating one from Grace, one is not disposed to receive the promises and Graces received from Holy Communion.

Can you imagine yelling words of hatred at your mom or dad, and then expecting them to cook and feed you without so much as saying "I'm sorry." This is what it means to be in a state of Mortal Sin, of having offended the One who loves us, without moving to heal that relationship.

For Holy Communion, this also means that if one is not in such a state; if one has sinned but not in a grievous way, then with contrition of heart, recalling to mind that we have sinned, and recognizing that we are not worthy to receive the promise that has ben given, one is disposed to receive.

Most important to remember: DO NOT JUDGE those who do not receive Holy Communion, but if you cannot help but judge, judge according to the love that they show of honoring and recognizing that their house is not ready to
