PASTOR'S CORNER

Sleeping on the Job

After teaching the crowds in parables the entire day, Jesus turned to his disciples and said to them, "Let us cross to the other side." They got into the boat and when the storms hit, the disciples turned to the Lord who was asleep.

We have all been through times in our life when we have turned to the Lord and felt as though he were sleeping on the job; when he was not answering our prayers; when he was doing nothing to help us out of our difficulties. Maybe you are in the midst of one of these times now.

The Lords asleep is a sign of his humanity, that yes, even Jesus the Son of God grew weary and tired from the day's labor and needed time to rest and sleep. The act that he could not take care of everyone's needs all of the time and could not work endless hours, also tells us about our humanity and natural, physical limits.

It is also a sign of his faith and confidence in the disciples. He felt comfortable enough, going on the boat, knowing the likelihood of storms popping up over the sea at sunset, and having the divine knowledge that the storm was going to come, to take a cushion and go to sleep. He trusted the disciples to not only make it through the storm, but trusted his very mission and his own life to them.

The sleeping Lord is a test of our faith in his promise that no harm will come to those who love him and that he will not lead us into destruction. There is no reason to be afraid if we are following Him. There is nothing that we know that He does not already know. Do we trust him enough to let him sleep?
