

PASTOR'S CORNER

Him and Him Alone

As part of our seminary formation, we were fortunate enough to be taken on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. One of the places we visited was the recently recovered town of Magdala, the home of Mary Magdalene. By long tradition, Mary Magdalene was the woman who suffered for 12 years from hemorrhages and on the wall behind the altar, is a picture depicting her arm as she was reaching for the hem of Christ's clothes. This depiction helps call to mind some of the greater beauty of this moment, and also the long pain and suffering the Mary endured.

In Mark's Gospel account, we are told that not only had Mary suffered with this ailment for 12 years, but she "had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors and had spent all that she had." This was a woman of complete destitution. She had almost nothing left within her, but the strength to crawl on the ground and stretch out her hand far enough, just to touch the hem of Jesus's cloak. Maybe we can even imagine a man lost in the desert, tired, dehydrated, chapped lips and sunburned, crawling and reaching out for water with his final strength.

Why did Mary have to suffer for 12 long-years? Why hadn't the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob answered her prayers and given her healing? Why did she have to struggle all the way down to her last bit of strength?

Although we suffer, God did not create us to suffer. In the words of the Book of Wisdom "God formed man to be imperishable . . .but by the envy of the devil, death entered the world." While we first see Mary on the ground, a victim of the sin of others, of natural sickness, and likely her own sin, after touching Christ she is brought to her feet, approaches through the crowd and then "told him the whole truth."

Do not be discouraged if you have not been restored. If you have been fighting and praying for years without change; if others, like the bad physicians, continue to take advantage of you and press you onto the ground. But take a moment to consider whom you are turning toward. Not to ask simply: Do I pray? Do I go to church? But be bold and ask: Who am I going to for help? Are they of God? Do they seek my restoration? Do they see me as imperishable?

If you are turning to something or someone that is not of Christ, or a member of his Body, it will not lead you to healing. This is not punishment, but is because there is only one Who can heal and restore.

When Sacred Scripture says to love the Lord your God with all of your heart, your mind, soul and strength, this is what it means. Like the runner who can run no more, seek Him with all that you have.
