St. Mary's in Independence

A BRIEF HISTORY

The mission that laid the foundation for what would become the parish of St. Mary's began in 1823, marking St. Mary's as the first church to be established in Independence, Missouri and for what is now the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. It is rightfully known as "the Mother Church--Cradle of Catholicism" for this region of Missouri. As described in the historical accounts of the first priest serving the area, Rev. Charles de la Croix, this mission served both Native Americans and a few families that had begun settling in the newly formed town. The parish itself, was formally established by Fr. Bernard Donnelly in May of 1845 and the cornerstone of the church building laid in 1864, marking St. Mary's church as one of the rare churches built during the civil war. Since its completion in 1965, the steeple and goldplated cross have looked over the arrival of many and growth of Independence.

BOY SCOUTS AT ST. MARY'S

The Boy Scouts have been a long and important part of the history of St. Mary's and for our nation. Most men of my generation and those prior, including myself, spent at least a time in the Boy Scouts. These are often treasured and valuable memories that helped us grow into manhood. Unfortunately, the organization itself has undergone some significant changes in recent years that have necessitated many Dioceses to evaluate the relationship between the organization and the Church. In recent months, our own Diocese has conducted a similar evaluation. Bishop Johnston has concluded that for the good of the faith and the members of the Scouts, the Scouts can continue their affiliation with parishes, however, they must be chartered by the parish. I have been in conversation with the Troop Leader for several weeks and we are in accord that they will not become a chartered member of the parish. As a result, they also will no longer be able to use any of the facilities, which includes storage of equipment. I have asked that they move their gear from storage by the end of this month. PASTOR'S CORNER

THE PRIVILEGED FEW:

There is a good chance that if you read the title to this week's column, many of you are anticipating something negative to follow. The idea of the privileged few has roundly become used to describe injustice in the world and to refer to the wealthy or those who don't have to abide by the same laws as we do. But to be privileged is a gift. I always say that it is a privilege for me to celebrate the Mass of someone's funeral, to be with someone at that monumental moment of their life and to be the one standing at the head all of their friends and loved ones as we present him to our heavenly Father. A privilege is a grace and blessing that is bestowed upon us. But like so many other words of blessing and virtue, the world has sought to turn something good into something bad. If I were to walk into a crowd and shout: Thank God that I am privileged! We all know what the likely reactions would be from people around me.

This Sunday, July 16th is the annual memorial of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, whose brown scapular many Catholics wear, and what was made more well known when it slipped out from underneath Harrison Butker's jersey as he was kicking the Super Bowl winning field goal. In bestowing her scapular upon St. Simon Stock and all of the Carmelites, our Blessed Mother said:

"This shall be the privilege for you and for all the Carmelites,

that anyone dying in this habit shall be saved."

The "this" she is referring to is the Scapular itself. It is a privilege to wear the clothing that marks us as belonging to and now under the protection of the Mother of God. It is not a right. Many of you are also likely hearing some variant of echoing words of your own father or mother, after having taken something for granted. A privilege is a gift from our heavenly Father and something that warrants due appreciation and love.

In their beginning, as pilgrims to the holy land and some fighters in the crusades, gathered around the spring of Elijah on Mt. Carmel, they sought a life of quietness and devotion to our Lord and began calling themselves the Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mt. Carmel. They sought to draw closer in union to our Lord, through her. They, like Elijah, saw her in the coming cloud that promised rain and an end to the drought. And so, to St. Simon Stock Our Lady of Mt. Carmel came and offered her scapular, a garment that represented both the Order's love and devotion to her, and her promises of protection and faithfulness to them. Throughout the centuries, many of the laity also wanted to share in the same devotion and promises to her, and so the Order began sharing this privilege through the donning of the small scapular.
