BOY SCOUTS AT ST. MARY'S

The Boy Scouts have been a long and important part of the history of St. Mary's and for our nation. Most men of my generation and those prior, including myself, spent at least a time in the Boy Scouts. These are often treasured and valuable memories that helped us grow into manhood. Unfortunately, the organization itself has undergone some significant changes in recent years that have necessitated many Dioceses to evaluate the relationship between the organization and the Church. In recent months, our own Diocese has conducted a similar evaluation. Bishop Johnston has concluded that for the good of the faith and the members of the Scouts, the Scouts can continue their affiliation with parishes, however, they must be chartered by the parish. I have been in conversation with the Troop Leader for several weeks and we are in accord that they will not become a chartered member of the parish. As a result, they also will no longer be able to use any of the facilities, which includes storage of equipment. I have asked that they move their gear from storage by the end of this month. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to Fr. Kendall.


In completing the work, they have also added extra coatings of protectant so that she can be cleaned thoroughly, including the removal of paint, if this should happen again.

PASTOR'S CORNER

THE AGING SPIRITUAL LIFE:

Getting old is a good thing. It was around my mid-thirties when I realized this. The details of the moment escape me, but there came an evening when the thought came to mind: Simply living takes effort. It felt like the first 25 years or so of life had been pretty much a given. Certainly there were times of difficulty and hardship: riding my bike in freezing rain to get to work; reeling from the abandonment of a biological father; living off of free boxes of mac & cheese. But, physically, I healed quickly from injuries and could eat pretty much what I wanted. It had felt like I could take being alive as a given. Then a switch happened and I had to start paying attention to taking care of myself, pay the price for not following my doctor's instructions, and other like things. It was then that I started wanting credit for each year that I lived through. If I make it to 60, 80 or 90, I will want to claim all of those years and the work that it takes to get there. There is no other way to get to 90 than to live through 90 years.

Aging is not an easy process, but it is a very good thing, even bearing the signs of aging: the stories that go into our scars, the callousing of skin, greying of hair; and aging is even very good for us humans. Marketers and advertisers have known this for a long time, selling us things like barrel-aged whiskey, 20-year old cheddar, and even the 5-year Aged Sumatra coffee is extraordinarily tasty (the beans are aged before they are roasted). St. Mary's is the oldest parish in the diocese and celebrating our 200th anniversary. There is no other way to it, than going through 200 years. Time is a value in and of itself. This is also true in the spiritual life.

We are very familiar with the parables that the Gospel presents to us this Sunday: how the Kingdom of Heaven is likened to the man who sowed good seed, a mustard seed and yeast. All of these things are living, they produce new life and they take time to develop and make their effects. There are things that one can do to help the seed grow faster and bread to rise more quickly, but most of the time, you simply have to wait. And there are times, as any bread maker will know, when you wait for the required hour, and it still hasn't risen; so you wait longer.

Advancing, growing and aging in the spiritual life; drawing closer to our Lord and His Heart; gaining in wisdom and understanding; progressing along the way of perfection; ascending the mountain of God, takes time, endurance, perseverance and work. So do not be discouraged by how slowly something may grow or if you have not reached the end, but continue to nurture, give warmth, cultivate and continue aging your spiritual life.
