FINAL WEEK TO PURCHASE TICKETS



ST. MARY'S & KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SantaCaliGon Parking Lot Fundraiser



Annually, in early September, we open the Church parking lot to the public for paid, secured festival parking. This year the Festival runs from Friday, September 1 through Monday, September 4, 10am to 10pm daily. We are asking each parishioner to volunteer to staff the parking lot for at least one, 2-hour time slot and we need four volunteers per time slot. Pastor's Corner

CELEBRATE:

This Sunday, we celebrate the Transfiguration of the Lord. It's celebration on August 6th goes back nearly 1800 years, marking the anniversary of the dedication of the first church built on Mt. Tabor, the high mountain of the Transfiguration. Even today, you can travel to the Holy Land and look through a glass floor at the very rock upon which Jesus stood and he was *transfigured* before the Disciples. While there are great Mysteries revealed to us in this one moment, a moment that even Moses and Elijah had waited centuries for, our celebration of this feast day also brings to light a much simpler occasion and truth: We celebrate important events in the past, and this is a very good thing.

The celebration of these events accomplishes a few things. We offer the event a place of honor and respect. In celebrating a wedding anniversary, we give thanks and affirm the greatness of the marriage event that took place. We say, "This is an event that was so important that we remember it and recognize it for years afterward." We also not only celebrate the original event, but like a marriage, we celebrate all of the gifts and wonderful things that came from the fruit of the event.

Our celebrations give us the opportunity to share our joy with one another. Not only is the Transfiguration an event worthy of being honored, but it brings us great joy. Jesus is recognized as the Son of God; he fulfills the work of the law and the prophets; he has opened up for us the gates of heaven; and he has revealed the Glory and beauty of our human bodies. Why would such an event and discovery not continue to bring us great happiness and joy.

In our celebrating, we can also be reminded of the tradition and practice of the True Icons of Eastern Catholics. What marks an image as a *True Icon*, rather than simply a religious picture, is that the icon is a conduit and imperfect embodiment of the one depicted. The priest is an icon of Christ. He is not the fullness of the real presence of Christ, like the Eucharist, but Christ is within the priest and is at work through him, as he is an imperfect conduit for Christ continuing to be present in the world.

To celebrate the gifts and events that God has given to us is a Good and necessary thing.

On August 15th, we not only celebrate the Assumption of Mary into heaven, but begin celebrating the 200th anniversary of the founding of St. Mary's in Independence. I know that we have a lot going on in our lives, daily struggles and stresses in life. This is an occasion to raise our eyes to heaven; to remember the true life for which we are made (the one revealed in Transfiguration); to be recollected to the promises of our Lord; to remember the source of our beauty and Joy; and celebrate all of the work of salvation God has brought to Independence.
