

## PASTOR'S CORNER

### **EVERY SEAT WAS FULL:**

An account of the 100th anniversary celebration of the building of St. Mary's church describes the vision of spotlights shining on "newly gold-leafed cross" and sounds of a "90 voice choir" raising their voices to God as being greeted with awed silence and applause by thousands of people. It was a fitting end to 3 nights of pageants to honor "140 years of parish life, 100 years of the Church (building)." Last night, we added to the celebrations, led by our Bishop Johnston, we began the celebration of what is now 200 years since Fr. Charles de la Croix, a French Redemptorist priest, arrived here and celebrated the first Mass.

As Bishop Johnston recalled last night, it was a very different time and there have been a lot of changes. This area was very sparsely populated, and there were even fewer Catholics. Missouri itself had only been a state for 2 years. The land west of here, across the great plains of Kansas and over the Rockies, was a spread of wilderness, inhabited by millions of buffalo. Kansas City itself, would not be established for another 15 years, the Diocese of Kansas City, not for another 57 years and there were only 24 States in the Union. We have seen a civil war, the raising of a native son to the Presidency (himself attending St. Ann's school) and a drive to Oregon can be made in just 1 day, when it took up to 6 months over the Oregon Trail.

After Mass, our Bishop added to the story. While it is good to recognize and celebrate our history. We stand on the shoulders of 200 years of saints bringing the Gospel. And as any good team, he says, thinking especially of Andy Reid and the Kansas City Chiefs, we can't simply look fondly on the past, but retool, bring in new players (new saints) and continue looking toward the future and what is next for the Church in Independence. We stand on their shoulders, not so we can stay at this height and admire the view from here, but to climb higher and raise someone else to stand on ours.

The saying that Every Seat Was Full, was not about the celebration of the 100th anniversary, but lat night. It was a more than beautiful sight to see the church full. Chairs had to be brought over from the ministry center for people to sit. The choir, 12 voices (echoing the voices of the Apostles), filled the air with Gounod's Gloria. With the Bishop, Deacons and servers surrounding the altar, the people's voices rang loudly in reciting the creed and all of our prayers. It was a grand night and celebration, truly fitting of the start to this Bicentennial celebration.

The better part, for me, is that I recognized almost every face. Our church was not full because of visitors coming to a spectacle, but it IS full of witnesses and our brothers and sisters. The church is strong, it is well and joyful and beautiful. Thank God for you, your love and faith for Him, and what you give to St. Mary's. It is a privilege that I am here with you, and as a child born in the Bicentennial of our nation, to be here in this Bicentennial.
