

Pastor's Corner

Enthronement

When St. Teresa of Jesus returned to the monastery of the Incarnation at Avila to be the new prioress, the sisters locked the doors to prevent her from entering. This had been her home for many years, it was where she first entered Carmel, but, as our Lord said, "no prophet is accepted in his hometown." They were comfortable in their lives and such a young daughter had no business coming back to them, telling them everything they had been doing wrong and how they should live. They were so offended by her, that having been named prioress she, and her accompaniment had to break into the convent. Many eyes, and scowls, were obviously on her on that first night as the sisters gathered into the chapel for prayer. But Teresa was not sitting where the prioress was supposed to be. Rather, in the place reserved for the prioress was a statue of the Blessed Mother. Teresa told the sisters: there is your prioress. She is the one who leads us in a life toward Christ.

During the month of October, I am strongly encouraging the homes of our parish to celebrate the Enthronement of Mary. Like St. Teresa did in reminding her sisters that Mary was the true prioress, we are enthroning Mary as the Queen of the house. The enthronement places the home intentionally under her care and protection. By enthroning her, you also set her as a guide to lead you in your daily life toward Christ.

Some may be afraid that placing Mary as the head of the house is taking that position away from Christ, and leaning toward idolizing her. But remember her words at the wedding as she told the servants "do whatever he tells you to do." Is this not also the work of the Queen, to speak and act on behalf of the King. The queen does not supplant or take the position away from the King, but helps point the way to him. Through Mary's Queenship, we are drawn to Christ's Kingship.

In the Enthronement, you place a statue, or image in a prominent place so that whenever you enter your home, she is there to greet you, but everyone who enters the home is also reminded that the home is under her authority and protection. Imagine walking into a home and the first thing that you see is a poster or statue of Iron Maiden, Darth Vader, or Moana from the Disney movie? This first thing that a person see's, sets the mood and the tone for the visit. It also expresses what is most important to the home owner. We don't often realize, however, that it is also a sign of what we want out of life, what is our goal.

For the Sisters of the Incarnation, they were afraid that St. Teresa wanted them to become just like her, they were afraid that she had become arrogant, proud and power hungry. When she placed Mary in her proper seat, it reminded them of the reasons for their vows and that their purpose in life was holiness, to become like her in following Christ, and to welcome all visitors to their home.
