CHURCH RENOVATION BAKER ARCHITECTS

This Tuesday, a representative from Baker Architects will be visiting the church as part of the process of developing plans to bring the renovations of St. Mary's to completion. They will conduct a full scan of the church and then produce three conceptual proposals that the parish will be able to discuss.

In the coming weeks, we will be scheduling some Town Hall meetings to foster conversation in the parish over the renovations, which we hope to bring to completion over the next 1-2 years.

Restoring Purity

Pastor's Corner

Not your Ways

Many of us are familiar with the words of the Prophet Isaiah that we hear this week:

my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD.

What we think is logical, reasonable, fair and of the utmost importance, He treats as foolish, sinister and meaningless. The parable we also hear this week is a good example of this. The landlord goes out early in the morning to hire workers. They agree upon a salary for the day and at the end of the day, they receive the agreed upon salary. But, he had also gone out later in the day and those who only worked a brief time, maybe for an hour or two, end up receiving the same amount. How unjust and unfair this is. If we work longer and harder than others, we should receive a greater compensation, after all, compensation is just that, payment received in return for labor and work. If one does more work, there should be a greater return; or if someone does a far better job. It is not right and just for those who do little to receive the same, or even a greater reward than those who do much. This is what many have argued recently with President Biden's desire to forgive the student loans of those who are in default. It's also what we see in the explosion of NFL salaries as players insist on a salary comparable to their ranking: the best QB should receive the highest salary. Conversely, we take this to mean that the highest paid is the best.

my thoughts are not your thoughts, says the LORD. Being the highest paid does not equate to being the best. Being the best does not equate to being the highest paid. For some to receive charity is not a punishment to those who paid their own way. There are many ways that God's wisdom and understanding of the Truth exceed our own, and our ways:

His goal for us is not to be the best QB (the GOAT), or even the best doctor, lawyer, or priest. Rather, to be virtuous, grow in the way of perfection and be a sheep, like His Son.

The most significant compensation we receive is not in money or the things of this world. Rather, compensation comes in the treasures of heaven—again, virtue, faith, hope and love.

God does not desire fairness, but salvation. In every moment He is looking not at what will bring a person comfort, nor what he has earned, but what will bring him closer to salvation.

The good of the one is not at the expense of the many, nor the many at the expense of the good. One of the most treasured lines from Star Trek is when Spok comes to the human realization that sometimes "the good of the one outweighs the good of the many." Our Father understands, however, that they are the same, there is no dichotomy. The good of the many serves the good of the one, and the good of the one, serves the good of the many.
