## CATECHESIS AND CATHOLIC CULTURE



**ST. BRIDGET OF SWEDEN** Saint Bridget of Sweden was one of the most privileged mystics in the history of the Church. Born to a wealthy family, she was given in marriage to a pious and good-hearted nobleman, with whom she raised eight children, including the future Saint Catherine of Sweden. When her husband died, Bridget founded an order of nuns, the Order of the Most Holy Savior, more commonly called the Bridgettines.

Devout from a young age, Saint Bridget also received numerous visions of Our Lord and Our Lady, including intimate details of Our Lady's early life, the Holy Family in Nazareth, and the Passion, first recorded in 1492.

## PASTOR'S CORNER

#### What do you Reject

The parable of the wicked tenants is one of the more well known of the parables on the Kingdom of God — realizing that we can describe almost all of the parables as one of the more well known. We are all familiar with the tenants who had been given management of the vineyard, but when it came time for the harvest, they were so wicked and vile that they not only killed the Master's agents that came to collect his share of the harvest, they even killed his son. We know that Jesus was describing himself as the Son and was confronting the chief priests and the elders about their actions. Yet like all of the parables, there is much more than a simple warning to his enemies.

The vineyard is the nation of Israel. From among all of His lands and among all the other nations that He created, He chose them to be his beloved, He planted His choicest vines in them and built a hedge to protect them. None of these things did they do. The tenants, the people of Israel were not particularly talented and skilled, they did not build their house, nor survive by their own work. But God Himself, in His great love for them, was the reason for their success and the richness of the harvest. They did not even have to plant the vines, but simply take care of what the Father had given to them.

At the same time, we are the vineyard. This is not we, the Church or the baptized. It is not we, the people of the United States of America, but it is we, as an individual person; I am the vineyard, just as you are the vineyard.

You are the vineyard that our Father chose from among all others, dug a winepress, built a tower and put up a hedge around it. He created you with this much care, and planted within you the gifts of intellect (the tower) and creative abilities (the winepress which takes the fruit of the harvest and creates something to sustain and give to others). We can think about all of the various aspects of who you are and the fruit of your life, as this vineyard.

You are the tenants, leasing the vineyard (life) that God has given to you. And just as the tenants are to act as good stewards in taking care of what has been given to them, we are to act as good stewards of the life that God has given to us. We recognize that everything we are given, is not for our own good, though we receive the benefits and enjoyment of everything that we have been given; all that we have and are belongs to God and for the good of His Kingdom. But this is not about the renunciation of ownership. It is about rejection.

The tenants rejected the agents and even the son of the landowner. They rejected his messengers and the agreements they had made. That is, they rejected virtue and promises they had made. The reward for rejecting what is good, is judgment and being cast out from what has been given to you. Rather, they accepted greed, pride and violence. What if they had rejected these instead of Him? What if they had rejected envy and jealousy of His son?

What we reject, we have no inheritance in. If you reject the things of the Lord, you have no inheritance in Him; but if you reject vice, you will have no inheritance in vice. What do you reject
